

#### **PREFACE**

The City of Calgary Archives is a section of the City Clerk's Department. The Archives was established in 1981. The descriptive system currently in use was established in 1991. The Archives Society of Alberta has endorsed the use of the Bureau of Canadian Archivists' Rules for Archival Description as the standard of archival description to be used in Alberta's archival repositories. In acting upon the recommendations of the Society, the City of Calgary Archives will endeavour to use RAD whenever possible and to subsequently adopt new rules as they are announced by the Bureau.

The focus of the City of Calgary Archives' descriptive system is the series level and, consequently, <u>RAD</u> has been adapted to meet the descriptive needs of that level. <u>RAD</u> will eventually be used to describe archival records at the fonds level.

The City of Calgary Archives creates inventories of records of private agencies and individuals as the basic structural finding aid to private records. Private records include a broad range of material such as office records of elected municipal officials, records of boards and commissions funded in part or wholly by the City of Calgary, records of other organizations which function at the municipal level, as well as personal papers of individuals. All of these records are collected because of their close relationship to the records of the civic government, and are subject to formal donor agreements.

The search pattern for information in private records is to translate inquiries into terms of type of activity, to link activity with agencies which are classified according to activity, to peruse the appropriate inventories to identify pertinent record series, and then to locate these series, or parts thereof, through the location register. Inventories of private records can also be accessed through the inventory of any civic department to which it might happen to be linked.

Existing inventories of private records are revised as additions of records are received and described at the Archives.

# **INTRODUCTION**

The records of OCO'88, the organizing committee for the staging of the XV Olympic Winter Games, were acquired by the City of Calgary Archives through an agreement signed 1990 January 22 between The City of Calgary, the Calgary Olympic Development Association (CODA) and the XV Olympic Winter Games Organizing Committee. The process of arrangement and description began before that time with the permission of CODA.

The records described in this inventory are part of accession PR-90-001. The original extent of the entire collection of records from OCO'88 at the time of the accession was approximately 620 containers. With records received as the result of an accrual of OCO'88 material in 1991 August, the total extent of the records of the Executive Group of OCO'88 after arrangement and description is 21.2 m.

This inventory was prepared initially by Linda Janzen in 1990 February, and revised into RAD format by Glennda Leslie in 1992 September.

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#### **ADMINISTRATIVE HISTORY**

The XV Olympic Winter Games Organizing Committee (XVOWGOC) was established in accordance with the Olympic Charter to organize the Olympic Winter Games in Calgary, Alberta in 1988 February.

The Committee was a direct outgrowth of the Calgary Olympic Development Association (CODA), which was established in 1957 and incorporated as a non-profit organization in accordance with The Societies Act of Alberta sometime thereafter. The aims of CODA, a body consisting of a Board of Directors and a membership of 75,000 Calgarians, are to develop a continuing sports program in Calgary and Canada through hosting sporting events, developing new facilities for sports, improving coaching programs, and developing funding programs for sport. CODA had made three bids to the International Olympic Committee (IOC) for Calgary to host Olympic games before 1972, each of them unsuccessful. CODA was resurrected in 1978 as the corporate vehicle to make a new bid to host the Olympic Winter Games in 1988. The degree of continuity of the earlier CODA through to the CODA of 1978 and after is not entirely clear. Through its Olympic Winter Games Bid Committee, CODA engineered the Calgary bid to host the 1988 Winter Olympics, which was finally successful at a meeting of the IOC in Baden-Baden. On 1981 September 30, the hosting of the XVOWG was awarded to Calgary as host city. This was done in the form of a two-way agreement between the IOC on one hand, and the Canadian Olympic Association (COA) and The City of Calgary on the other hand, as specified in the Olympic Charter.

At the time of the preparation of the bid, CODA had envisioned an Organizing Committee<sup>1</sup> with close links to itself, and this is in fact what eventually developed. The Organizing Committee required to be established by the Olympic Charter was also required to be disbanded within six months after the end of the Games. It was incompatible with CODA's long-term aims, and its emphasis on a sport legacy which had helped it win the Games for Calgary, to dissolve after the Games. It was therefore decided that it was appropriate to establish a separate committee with the limited and specific purpose of organizing the XVOWG in 1988.

Members of the Board and Executive of CODA began to do this immediately following the winning of the bid. CODA members, Board and Executive began meeting in October to organize. By 1981 December, the Executive Committee of CODA was meeting regularly and calling itself informally the "Operating Committee of the XVOWG Organizing Committee". Legal procedures for incorporation of the Committee were underway by 1981 November. CODA later decided to bill the Organizing Committee for operating expenses from 1981 October 1. Hence, it is appropriate to consider the XVOWGOC to have been established on that day. It is also in 1981 October that the XVOWGOC record series begin. Records created before that time remained in the possession of CODA, or, where records created before 1981 October were required by OCO'88 for its operations, those records were returned to CODA when the OCO'88 offices were shut down in the summer of 1988. During the period from 1981 October to 1982 April, when the XVOWGOC became a

legal entity itself, CODA saw itself "operating as an interim OCOG on behalf of the COA and the City of Calgary".<sup>2</sup>

The COA authorized the incorporation of the XVOWGOC at its Executive meeting in 1982 January. An application was made for incorporation under the Canada Corporations Act, and incorporation was granted under Part II of the statute, as a non-profit corporation, by Letters Patent dated 1982 April 16. The name of the corporation was the "XV Olympic Winter Games Organizing Committee". A shorter name, "OCO'88", was proposed and adopted by the Committee in the fall of 1982. It was to be an acronym for "Olympiques Calgary Olympics 1988", and was an official name of the Committee for use in the press and public.

The contractual obligations of the COA and the City of Calgary to the IOC with respect to the organizing of the Games were delegated by agreement to the XVOWGOC. These agreements were in place by 1983 September, and from that time OCO'88 was fully empowered by all those responsible to organize the Olympic Winter Games in 1988 February.

The application for incorporation was signed by ten members of the CODA Executive. These ten applicants were Richard Pound, James Worrall, Maurice Allan, Roger Jackson, Ralph Klein, Robert Niven, Frank King, William J. Warren, John Lecky, and David S. Leighton. They became an interim Board of Directors of the XVOWGOC, until a Board could be elected. They referred to themselves in documents for a time as the "Incorporating Board of Directors".

According to the original By-Laws established at the time of incorporation in 1982 April, the membership of the XVOWGOC was to consist of the subscribers to

the original application for incorporation, and anyone else admitted to membership by the Board of Directors, as well as anyone designated from time to time by the provisions of the Olympic Charter. In practice, new members were admitted from time to time, and the "membership" and the "Board of Directors" included the same people.

The membership of the XVOWGOC was required to hold an Annual General Meeting, at which they were to elect a Board of Directors. According to the original By-Laws, there were to be ten Directors. This reflected the fact that ten individuals supported the original application for incorporation. The By-Laws were amended in 1983 March, to expand the Board of Directors to twenty-five. In 1984 January, the By-Laws were amended once again to allow for a Board of Directors not exceeding thirty-five. The Directors were to hold office for the period of one year, but were to be eligible for re-election immediately upon the conclusion of a term of office.

Almost immediately following incorporation in 1982 April, the Board began to consider expansion of membership in the Board to twenty-five, hoping to include eight government appointees and seven new Directors at Large. The need for government representatives on the Board was a frequently discussed issue over the next eighteen months or so, since the matter was repeatedly tabled pending the conclusion of an agreement between OCO and the COA. By-Laws approving the expansion of the Board were conditionally approved in 1983 March at the AGM. The same meeting elected Anita Szaslak and George de Rappard as federal and provincial government representatives, respectively, on the Board of Directors, conditional on the approval of the COA/OCO contract. The change in By-Laws to

allow an expanded Board and the appointments of the two government representatives were made "official" by the Board at a meeting on 1983 September 23. Ralph Klein, the Mayor of Calgary, was originally a member of the Board in his personal capacity, and by the 1983 By-Law changes became a member by virtue of his office as Mayor. Szaslak and de Rappard, as well as Bob Holmes of The City of Calgary, who became an official City of Calgary representative after the 1984 By-Law changes, had apparently been attending Board of Directors meetings regularly prior to their official appointments.

A Nominating Committee had been established in 1982 August for the purpose of seeking out and recommending candidates for senior positions in the XVOWGOC. It consisted of three Board members, King (Chairman), Jackson, and Lecky. In 1983 October, the Nominating Committee was given a renewed mandate to explore candidates for further expansion of the Board to twenty-five from its then-current membership of eleven. It was decided to consider individuals who would bring financial expertise to the Board, and others who would make the XVOWGOC a nationally-representative body.

After receiving applications for membership in the Board of Directors in 1983

November and December, the Nominating Committee presented a short list of candidates to the Executive Committee and the Board of Directors for approval before they were presented for election at the AGM. By-Laws had been amended in 1984 January to allow up to thirty-five Directors, and at the AGM of 1984 May 18, the membership elected a slate of twenty-eight Directors to the Board, including official representatives of the three levels of government (federal, provincial and

municipal), the IOC and the COA. The structure of the Board remained the same from that time, and its membership changed only minimally.

The Board of Directors was required to appoint annually from its membership a Chairman and Vice Chairman. Frank King and Bob Niven, respectively, were appointed to these positions every year.

An Executive Committee of the Board of Directors was required to be appointed by the Board in accordance with the By-Laws. The Executive Committee was empowered to direct the business and affairs of the XVOWGOC to the extent to which the Board of Directors delegated such authority to it. In the original 1982 By-Laws, this body was called the "Management Committee", and became the "Executive Committee" in the 1983 By-Law amendments. Since in the early years of OCO, there was really no distinction between the Board of Directors and other bodies of the XVOWGOC, the "Management Committee" of the 1982 By-Laws never existed in practice, and a group of Directors called themselves the "Executive Committee" even in 1982.

The "Management Committee" of the 1982 By-Laws should be carefully distinguished from a "Management Committee" consisting of paid professional staff which began to meet informally in the spring of 1982 and eventually became more formalized as the "Executive Management Team" which met as the "Management Committee".

The Executive Committee structure and membership was established by the 1983 By-Laws to include the following members: IOC member or members resident in Canada; President and Secretary-General of the COA; Chairman and Vice

Chairman of the Board; a representative of the Government of Canada; a representative of the Government of Alberta; the Mayor of Calgary or his representative; and at least three Directors at Large. The Committee was not to exceed twelve in number. 1984 By-Law amendments made small changes in the personnel structure of the Executive Committee. All of the Executive Committee were members of the Board.

In 1982 August, the "Incorporating Board of Directors" as they called themselves, appointed themselves officially to the Executive Committee. In subsequent years, appointments to the Executive Committee were made by the Board at their regular meetings, as the situation required.

During the early years of OCO, the Board of Directors met quarterly, as required by the By-Laws, and its Executive Committee met in all the other months of the year. In the early years, it seems that in practice, only the core members of the Executive Committee (i.e. the original CODA people) attended the monthly meetings, while the quarterly Board meetings were attended by the government representatives and Directors at Large as well. In later years (1986 and following), the Board began to meet monthly, as the Executive Committee did.

It is very difficult to distinguish the Board of Directors and the Executive

Committee in practice. Minutes of meetings may call the body which is meeting both
the Board and the Executive in the same document. It also happened on occasion
than an Executive meeting would be called, but when the meeting was in session, it
would be declared a Board meeting rather than an Executive meeting. Sometimes
an Executive meeting would be adjourned briefly for the purpose of holding a Board

meeting in the same room with the same people in attendance, or vice-versa. Thus, in practice, the membership, the Board, and the Executive of the XVOWGOC were not distinguished.

In practice, the functions of the Board and the Executive were similar. The Executive considered most issues and made recommendations to the Board on both policy and management items of business. This is reflected in the fact that when the Board began to meet monthly around 1986 June, the Agenda Books circulated to Board members doubled as the Agenda Book for an Executive meeting which was usually held the day before the Board meeting. There is thus no distinction between Agenda Book and Minutes series of the Board and those of the Executive, and these were maintained as a single series in the Executive offices. It is worth noting that when the Board began to open its meetings to the public and press around 1987 February, the Executive Committee continued to meet in camera to discuss the same agenda.

The function of the Board, generally speaking, was to act as trustees of the organization of the XVOWG and to offer advice to senior management. The Executive Committee had the same function to the extent to which the Board chose to delegate its authority to it. At its meetings, the Board considered the substance of agreements between OCO, the COA and governments, and heard reports from government representatives on progress made in fulfilling their specific obligations under those agreements. The Board and Executive also dealt with broadcasting issues and agreements. The Board was responsible through its Chairman, Frank King, for all IOC and COA relations. The Board heard regular reports from all Vice

Presidents, in the form of the "Management Team Report", on operational issues within each Group. The Board also heard reports from some committees, including the Audit Committee, Legacy Committee, Nominating Committee, Torch Committee, Insurance Committee and Finance and Budget Committee. The Board was responsible for authorizing all budgeted expenditures over \$200,000 and all unbudgeted expenditures over \$50,000. Ultimately, all aspects of the organization of the Games were under the general direction of the Board of Directors. Individual Board members were assigned the roles of liaison with one or more of the sixty-odd volunteer committees.

According to the By-Laws, the Board was to designate an officer to be President of the corporation, and to have the general and active management of its affairs subject to the direction the Executive Committee. The President, a paid employee, was entitled to be present at Board and Executive meetings, but was a member of neither body. The first President appointed by OCO, Dr. David Leighton, assumed his duties full-time in 1982 September after having worked part-time during the preceding summer, and resigned the position in 1983 January. On his departure, an "Internal Review Committee" (IRC) was established by the Executive Committee at a meeting of 1983 January 21. In some documents this IRC is referred to as the "Executive Directors". The purpose of the committee of six members of the Executive was to function as a signing authority and expenditure approval authority during the period OCO was without a President, and to seek a new President. The IRC met between 1983 January and June on a regular basis, and wrapped up its activities in 1983 June, shortly after Bill Pratt was appointed as

the new President and Chief Executive Officer. Pratt remained President of OCO throughout the remainder of its existence. He was responsible for the day-to-day operations of OCO'88. The Vice Presidents reported directly to him. The President had authority to authorize all expenditures up to a specified limit, beyond which authority was reserved to the Board.

Criticisms of the management style of Mr. Pratt as President resulted in the establishment of a second "Internal Review Committee" in the fall of 1986. This was a completely different committee from that by the same name which functioned in the winter and spring of 1983. The purpose of the 1986 committee of three was to explore the recognized problems of lack of co-operation among volunteers and paid staff and the lack of openness to the public. This committee, in a report which was made public by the Board of Directors, recommended the appointment of Frank King, the Chairman of the Board, as a paid employee to be Chairman and Chief Executive Officer of OCO'88. The Chairman's function was to monitor the performance of the President and act as liaison between the President, the Board, and the public. It was felt that a blend of King's and Pratt's management styles would enhance the operations and public image, local and international, of the Organizing Committee.

With King's appointment as Chairman and C.E.O., Pratt's position became President and Chief Operating Officer (C.O.O.). Although as Chairman of the Board, King had had an important public role from the beginning of OCO, this role was increased after his appointment as a paid employee in 1986 December.

The larger organizational structure of OCO began to take shape in the spring of 1982. The subject of an organizational plan was in fact an item frequently on the agenda at Board and Executive meetings beginning in 1981, immediately after CODA won the bid for the 1988 Winter Games. By spring 1982, several Vice Presidents had been appointed. These were V.P. Executive Operations, V.P.Games Operations, V.P. Sports, V.P. Facilities and Technical Services, V.P. Communications, and V.P. Administration. The V.P. Executive Operations, a position originally held by Don Siler, acted as executive assistant to the President and co-ordinated arrangements with governments, the IOC, and the International Sports Federations. The V.P. Games Operations, John Pickett, was responsible for all non-sport activities, including Olympic Villages, transportation, security, ceremonies, tickets and clothing. The V.P. Sports, Brian Murphy, was responsible for all athletic events, as well as liaison with National and International Sports Federations and technical delegates. The V.P. of Facilities and Technical Services was responsible for all physical facilities, timing, and computer services and the transportation and communication infrastructure. The V.P. Communications, Frances Jackson, was responsible for media, public relations and cultural events and volunteers. The Vice President Administration, Bill Nield, was responsible for financial management, information control, personnel, legal affairs, and purchasing.

After Pratt's appointment as President of OCO, some Vice Presidents were for a time between 1984 and 1985 called Senior Vice Presidents. In 1985

December, the Senior Vice President positions were abolished. At that time, Senior

Vice Presidents became Vice Presidents of Groups and Vice Presidents became General Managers of Divisions with the Groups.

The volunteer component of OCO'88 had been a major feature of the original organizational plan drawn up during the bid phase. The plan, to have a largely volunteer organization with relatively few paid staff for day-to-day operations was a plan modelled on the Edmonton Commonwealth Games held in 1978. The original organizational plan called for "Olympic Councils", or volunteer committees, consisting of "the best qualified members of the community" to provide advice and direction, and to prepare budgets, studies and cost estimates. By 1983 September, 300 volunteers were serving on Councils and committees.

In 1982, Vice Presidents and the President began meeting as the "Management Committee" which later became known as the Executive Management Team (EMT). The Management Committee reported regularly to Board or Executive meetings. While they met beginning in spring 1982, when Bill Pratt became President in 1983 June, the EMT became more formal and presented monthly "Management Team Reports" to the Executive and Board of Directors. The EMT approved plans, budgets, schedules, expenditure proposals and contracts. A distinction between a "Management Executive Committee" and a "Management Committee" is noted on an organization chart of 1984, but this distinction is not reflected in the records and seems to have had no operational consequences. The Management Executive Committee consisted, on paper, of the President and the Senior Vice Presidents, and was to meet only at the call of the President

The organizational structure of OCO eventually developed from the 1982 structure into eight functional areas called "Groups". These were, in 1987 September, Communications, Finance, Marketing, Operations, Sports, Team'88 Services, Technology, and Executive. Each Group was headed by a Vice President, except the Executive Group, headed by the Chairman. Each Group except the Executive had several Divisions, each under a General Manager, and Divisions were often subdivided into Departments headed by Managers. Other subordinate administrative units existed below the departmental level. At its peak, OCO'88 had 488 employees.

The Executive Group consisted of the Chairman and President and the departments and officers reporting directly to them. The Press Secretary position, reporting directly to the Chairman, was established in 1986 December when King was appointed Chairman. In 1987 June, the Press Secretary position was transferred to the Media Division of the Communications Group, and a new position of Executive Assistant to the Chairman was established. The Executive Assistant's duties were to plan schedules, act in liaison with governments and the community, write speeches, and deal with any problems which might arise. The Security Department (until 1987 October) and the Internal Auditor reported directly to the President. The Executive Group, as part of the corporate administrative structure, is distinct from the Executive Committee of the Board of Directors, which was one of the governing bodies. Likewise, the Executive Management Team was a committee apart from the Executive Committee of the Board.

The larger organizational structure was fluid throughout the existence of OCO, and was frequently altered in response to perceived problems in operations.<sup>4</sup> In addition to the Group organizational structure, which was a centralized corporate structure, a decentralized Venue Management organization was put in place in 1986-1987 in preparation for the Games. This involved a blending of volunteer and staff organizational structures, and the establishment of command hierarchies at each individual venue.

Executive offices of OCO were in existence by the spring of 1982. In late 1982 November, the Executive offices moved to 300, 330 5th Ave. S.W., One Calgary Place. The offices moved in 1985 December to space in the newly-built Municipal Building. In 1987 October, staff began to move out to the venues, in preparation for the Games. During the Games themselves, an "EMT Center" was established at OCO'88 Headquarters in the Administration Building as the trouble-shooting center.

#### **SCOPE AND CONTENT NOTE**

The records of the Executive of OCO'88 consist of 14 series, each of which is introduced by a brief "Archival Description" section and a "Scope and Content" note. In some cases, added "Notes" complete the series descriptions.

In may ways, the "Administrative History" of the Executive Group is also the fonds level description of the records of OCO'88, for in it is described the foundations of the organization. The first six series consist of records of the Executive and/or Board of Directors as a whole--agenda, minutes, reports, correspondence and reference material. Series VII to X are the records of Frank King, the Chairman of OCO'88; the records in Series XI and XII were created by the President, William Pratt; and Series XIV consists of correspondence and reference materials collected by the Press Secretary and Assistant to the President, Gary Arthur. Of the latter series, only Series XIII is one of a general nature and consists of some of the earliest organizational records of OCO'88 created by the original OCO President, David Leighton and some of the members of the early OCO'88 administration.

The records of the Executive Group are "multiple media," but the vast majority of the material is textual. Photographs have been enclosed in acid-free enclosures and remain with their original files; oversize material (blueprints and plans) have been removed from their original files and placed in appropriate oversize storage. Notes have been added to indicate where this has been done.

The main conservation problem in these records was that of telefax documents. All "faxed" documents have been photocopied for the purposes of preservation.

A number of boxes of OCO records intended for the City of Calgary Archives were mistakenly sent to Kestrel Data Inc., the company responsible for the storage of OCO's financial records. This material was transferred to the Archives in 1991 August, and all accrued material from the Executive Group has been added to appropriate series.

#### **DESCRIPTION OF RECORDS**

I. Executive Group, XVOWGOC Board of Directors/Executive Committee, Agenda Books. -- October 1981-August 1993; (predominant 1981-1988). -- 2 m of text. -- 10 photo prints.

**Archival Description:** The OCO'88 Agenda Books were circulated to Board and Executive members in advance of each monthly meeting and generally included the agenda for the upcoming meeting, all reports and information for members to read in preparation for discussion of agenda items, and the minutes of the previous meeting for approval. This pattern was established as policy in 1983 August. Prior to that time, the agenda book format is less rigid, and sometimes only minutes are included in the record series, or minutes of a meeting were added to the agenda book for that date.

Each agenda book was circulated to members in a three-ring binder. Generally, a fold-out agenda page was attached at the back of the binder for the user's convenience. It listed numbered agenda items. Information pertaining to each item for discussion was separated by dividers with corresponding numbers. In most cases, these agenda pages and dividers remain, while the binders were discarded for conservation reasons.

The Executive Office did not maintain a "record copy" of these agenda books, or, if it did, it did not arrive at the Archives. Thus, this series is somewhat artificial in that the agenda books were gathered from various sources - most were maintained as individual file copies. This is reflected by a number stamped in red at the top right corner of many of the agenda book pages. It indicates a copy number. Several different copy numbers are included in this "series", reflecting that they were originally maintained separately. Frank King, the Chairman, regularly received copy #1; the President received copy #29. Many of the agenda books also contain notes pencilled in by those who used them.

As noted above, the agenda books include minutes. The practice which OCO established was to circulate "draft" copies of minutes of the previous meeting with the agenda book for the upcoming meeting. These were often stamped "DRAFT" or "CONFIDENTIAL". They were considered confidential only because they were not yet "approved". After discussion of the minutes at the next meeting, the draft copy either became the "APPROVED" version (and was often so stamped), or was amended and later circulated as the "approved" version. Hence, if one is seeking minutes of a meeting of a certain date, one should generally seek the agenda book for the subsequent meeting. This, of course, is not an absolute rule, since OCO records practices were not absolutely consistent especially before 1983 August.

It should also be kept in mind that since the agenda books were not maintained as a record copy, it may be necessary to consult other minutes series described below. In addition, it is necessary to consult the general files series of individual executive members for some minutes. The Minutes of the meetings of the Board held during the Games, for example, were not maintained in the agenda book series and must be sought in F. King's office records.

The agenda books are arranged in chronological order. They have been removed from their original three-ring binders and placed in sequentially numbered folders. Where an agenda book was too thick for one folder, it has been placed in two or three folders, indicated a, b, or c following the number.

**Scope and Content:** The agenda books cover meetings of the XVOWGOC members, Board and Executive Committee. The Board and Executive dealt with the full range of policy and management issues which arose in the course of the organization of the XVOWG. The members dealt with those issues reserved to them by the By-Laws of the corporation. Consult the administrative history or the agenda index for a more detailed indication of the contents of the records.

**Note:** The agenda page at the back of each agenda book lists items to be dealt with at the upcoming meeting. These agenda pages have been xeroxed and arranged in chronological order by the Archives, and are available to researchers as an interim finding aid. Her duties included the co-ordination of all activities of the Board of Directors, liaison with the IOC, and organization of all IOC meetings held in Calgary.

**Archival Description:** This series of records is divided into two distinct sub series or "blocks" of material, 1983-1985 and 1986-1988.

1983-1985: (Boxes 1-22) It is apparent that this block of files was packed into boxes in 1985, possibly in conjunction with the relocation of OCO offices to the new Municipal Building in December of that year. These seem to have been those files considered only semi-active at that time. Some additions were made to them after 1985, and thus some later material is included, but it seems that these records were maintained only in storage for reference purposes after 1985. These records include files with titles identical to those in use after 1985. The arrangement of the 1983-1985 files, at one time probably similar to that of the later part of the series, seems to have deteriorated as they were maintained as semi-active and inactive records. These records were packed in boxes numbered 1-9, and the material has been left in that order, which is rather unsystematic.

1986-1988: (Boxes 23-61) These records, which remained in active use until Pratt ceased to function as OCO President after the Games, are in alphabetical order as noted above. In the case of the records from the Operations Group (beginning with Box 45, p. 92), the material in these folders reflects administration divisions of OCO which were part of the Operations Group when the file system was set up. It does not reflect the later transfer of some of these departments to groups other than Operations after 1986.

**Scope and Content:** Pratt's general administration records consist of a single series of files identified by subject or correspondent, arranged alphabetically by file title. In some subject areas, files are arranged alphabetically within a particular subject heading, which makes it resemble a filing classification; hence, the alphabetical arrangement is not always clearly apparent. The alphabetical filing feature has been added in square brackets [] to the folder title in the list below, where that is not apparent from the title itself.

These records cover all of Pratt's activities as President from the time of his appointment in 1983 June to 1988 July, including his supervision of all of OCO operations of all functional Groups, liaison with governments, and special projects.

The other material consists of two plans, three blueprints, nine slides and 18 photo prints.

**Archival Description:** These records were created by the first President of OCO, David Leighton, who held that position from 1982 May-December, and by several Vice Presidents of the time, including S. Corbett, Vice President Revenues; W. Wardle, Vice President Marketing, and a Marketing Associate, Suzanne Curtis; and Don Siler, Vice President Executive Operations. Some of the records appear to have been created by those named above in their role as members or employees of CODA. These records reflect the very early activities of the organizing committee, but are fragmented and do not give a complete picture of the activities of OCO employees at that time. See individual folder descriptions.

**Scope and Content:** These fragments of early correspondence files of executive employees of OCO may have been gathered in an inactive records storage area well before OCO reached its peak period of activity. These fragments are a miscellaneous accumulation of records which were never maintained as a series while they were in active use.

The contents of the two folders in Box 3 were originally in a single binder. It seems that Bill Pratt had requested copies of the correspondence of his predecessor in office, David Leighton, and had been supplied with this material.

**Archival Description:** This series includes all records of Gary Arthur, who began his employment with OCO as Manager of Information Services Department of the Media Division. In 1986 December, in conjunction with the appointment of Frank King as CEO, and the desire to establish better public relations, Arthur became Press Secretary, reporting directly to King as part of the Executive Group. In 1987 June, he became Frank King's Executive Assistant. No distinction is made in this series between records created in these three positions and they were maintained as a single series.

**Scope and Content:** The folders are arranged alphabetically. An "Index to Files" included in this series by its creator indicates the file titles. That list was apparently not updated and does not list all files in the series.

The bulk of the folders consists of newspaper clippings of Olympic-related events and issues. The folders are identified by the subject of the clippings contained therein. Some correspondence is included.

The other material consists of 44 photo prints, 13 slides, two sound cassettes, one blueprint and one (musical) score.
