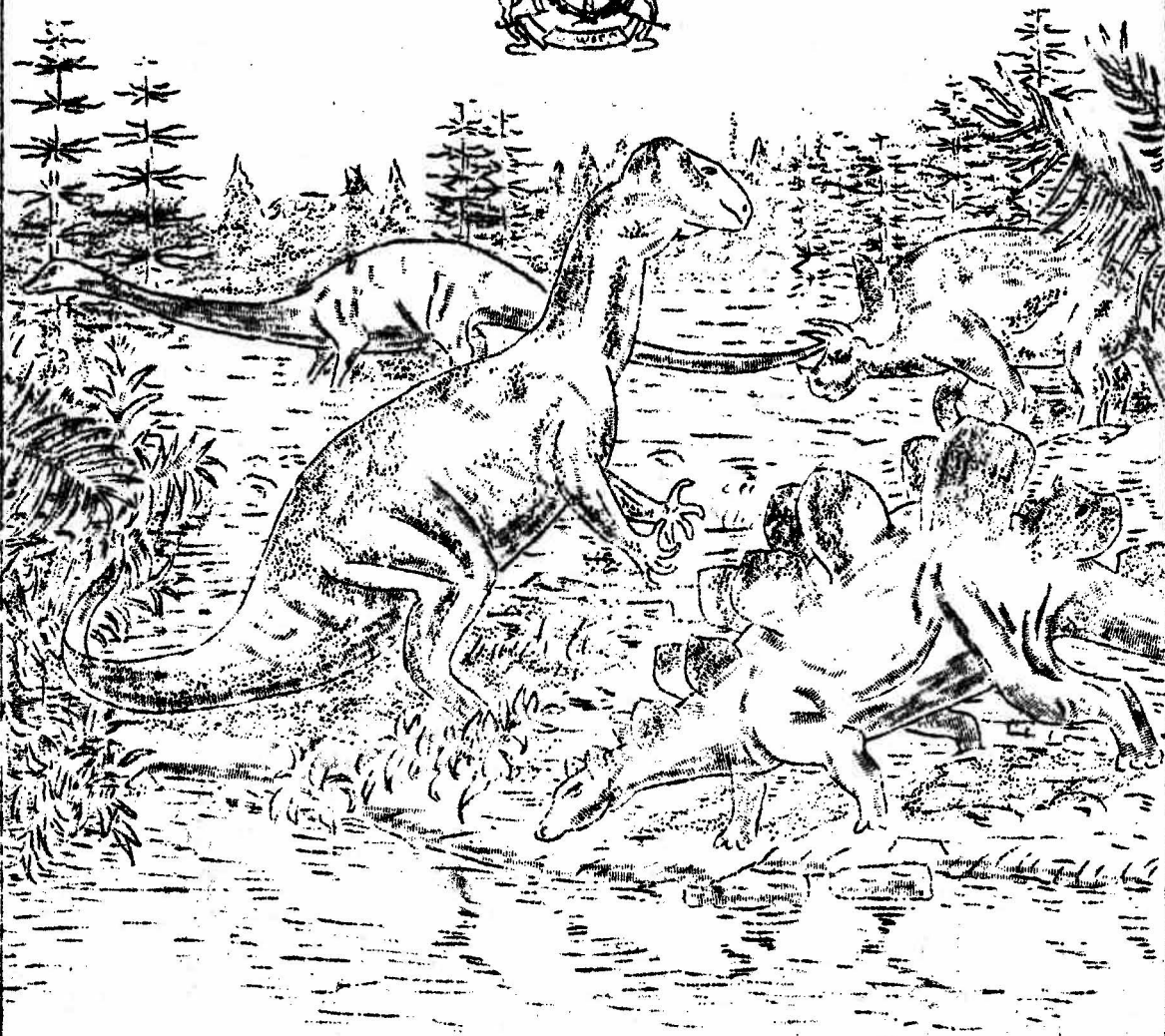

ANNUAL REPORT 1936

To His Worship the Mayor, Commissioner, and City Council:

Gentlemen;

I beg to present my 24th Annual Report dealing with the activities and accomplishments of the Parks Department during the year 1936.

The sum appropriated for the work of the Department for the past year was \$53,680.40. This included an additional \$2,000.00 for water which was paid direct to the Water Works Department, and so did not represent an increase, but actually a decrease as compared with the amount appropriated in 1935, namely, --\$52,000.00.

The amount actually expended was \$54,421.86. Revenue amounted to \$23,825.08, leaving a net expenditure of \$30,596.78.

It may be of interest to show the amounts appropriated for the work of the Department for the past five years:-

It will be noted that there has been a tremendous decrease, yet, during this period the Parks System and Recreational Facilities of this city have expanded enormously and it is only through the utilization of relief labour that it has been possible to carry on.

The total number of hours of this labour used during the past year was 356,128. These have been very evenly distributed throughout the year, as the following statement by months shows:-

In considering the number of relief recipients used and the work accomplished, it is important to take into account the fact that practically all those men who are physically unfit or are partially incapacitated are sent to this Department for "light duty".

Whilst the progress made in the development of new areas was not so great as in 1934-35, due to considerable reduction of the hours required to be worked by relief recipients, the past year was one of considerable achievement, for whilst the full complement of both the permanent staff and this class of labour is fully required, and is really far from adequate for maintenance work during the summer season, during the slack season

when an equal force is available it can be almost wholly diverted to construction work. Then very favourable weather conditions prevailed during autumn and early winter, so that it was possible, under these circumstances to make considerable progress with the projects already under way and development of new areas. We are badly handicapped, however, in regard to this class of work because of the need of trucks which we are not in a position to hire. Another severe handicap is our inability to purchase pipe for water services. It is useless to develop new areas, notwithstanding the urgent demand of the public, unless funds are available to install water services to maintain the improvements made. A case in point is that of South Calgary Park, for the slow development of which, as compared with those in some other districts, this Department has been severely criticized.

Recreational activities reached a high record during the year. The actual total use is impossible of measurement, and very hard to estimate. The numerous football and baseball fields were in constant use, whilst cricket was in progress in Riley Park at all times during the summer months, either in the form of matches or practice. Picnics were held daily at St. George's Island, and the Golf Course was well patronized. During the winter the ninety odd rinks were crowded at all times with skaters and hockey players.

Additions to Parks System: As at January 1st 1936 the System consisted of 103 pieces of property varying in size from .01 acres to 155 acres, and having a total area of 1,059.43 acres, together with 77 miles of street boulevard. This is exclusive of Bowness, Reservoir, and Victoria Parks, but includes the Cemeteries.

During 1936 the following were added:-

Lot 1, Block 22, Plan A1, Section 16, at the intersection of 5th Avenue West and Mewata Boulevard, designated as Mewata Triangle.

That portion of Lot 29, lying east of the west 25 feet in Block 19, Plan 1948P, Section 21, at the intersection of 7th Avenue and 5a Street N.W., designated as Sunnyside Triangle.

These two small areas are being developed in a very simple manner as flower gardens. As these plots were previously used as dumps for refuse of all kinds, the improvements already made are greatly appreciated by citizens living in the vicinity.

Lots 14 to 19 inclusive, Block 2, Plan A3, Section 14. This plot has been graded and is in course of development as a bowling green for the use of the Inglewood Bowling Club, which club has reimbursed the Parks Department for actual expenditures made to date. The green will, of course, be the property of the City of Calgary.

Weather: The winter of 1935-36 was marked by steady cold and a good deal of snow. These conditions were very favorable horticulturally and there was less winter-killing of the growth of trees and shrubs, and fewer losses amongst herbaceous plants than for many years. January was moderately cold with very little fluctuations of temperature. The early part of February was intensely cold, and very low temperatures prevailed throughout the month resulting in much frost-splitting of the trunks of trees, but no permanent damage resulted. It was comparatively mild (though not unseasonably so) during the early part of March, but later it was cold and stormy and there was much snow. There was considerable moisture during the late winter and early spring, and indications at that season were most favourable. Severe drought, however, prevailed throughout the summer, and the early promise of a good season failed to materialize. This drought continued throughout the autumn and winter till the end of the year, and the weather was remarkably open with unusually high temperatures and a great deal of wind. I greatly fear that much damage will result from this very severe and prolonged drought. A terrific gale swept our city on November 19th, doing much damage to buildings and fences.

A study of records indicates that, whilst, by comparison, this year's total precipitation is low, it is not very much lower than in some previous years which have appeared very much more favorable horticulturally. This clearly indicates that the amount

of the precipitation is not nearly so vital as the actual time when it comes. There is a striking contrast, however, between the precipitation of this past year with that of twenty years ago, when twelve inches fell in the months of June and July as compared with eight inches for the whole of 1936.

Lowest temperature, -35 on February 9th.

Highest temperature, 96 on July 23rd.

Last spring frost on May 18th.

First autumn frost on September 10th.

Subzero temperatures on 12 nights in January.

Arboriculture: As a result of last winter's favourable weather conditions, flowering shrubs gave a remarkably fine display.

Lilacs were particularly profuse during the flowering period.

During last winter pruning was done as follows:- The Cemeteries, Parkview, Rideau, Roxborough, Elbow Park and Mission Districts, including boulevards and all ornamental areas, South Calgary Park, Sunalta Triangle, Sunalta Ravine.

Trees pruned, 14,068; shrubs pruned, 13,187.

Tree and shrub pruning has barely been commenced this season due to the fact that most of the permanent staff, on whom I am dependent for this work, have been required to supervise gangs of relief workers. It is most important that this work should be done regularly each year, as, during the process of pruning crowded specimens are marked for transplanting, note is made of gaps to be filled and a general survey is made of all plantings with a view to proper maintenance and improvement. The only areas completed to date are Burnsland Cemetery, Memorial Park, Louise Bridge Plot, and Crescent Park.

All flower beds made a creditable showing during the season. Some comparatively new species and varieties used in Memorial Park attracted considerable attention.

ST. GEORGE'S ISLAND PARK: 4th Calgary Troop (Elks) Boy Scouts who held St. John's Ambulance certificates were in attendance at the Island each Sunday and holiday using, as their headquarters "Calgary's First House". Twenty-six cases ranging from epilepsy and sunstroke to minor cuts received first aid. Service was also rendered in the case of missing children and lost property.

Four Band Concerts were held.

Six hundred cubic yards of soil delivered to Island by a contractor was used partly to level football field and partly to fill between stone work on river bank and south driveway. The Public Works Department also acceded to our request to

dump all street sweepings collected in the east end of the city in this depression.

The west end of the north driveway raised to a higher level as a further protection from floods. Not possible to gravel the new surface with result roads in very bad condition all season, and had to be closed in wet weather. 850 yards gravel excavated from Dinoseur Garden placed on driveways this winter.

Several large, two small, picnic tables made, and necessary seats. Tables arranged in groups, permanently fixed, groups numbered and charted. This greatly facilitated allotment of space to the greatly increased number of picnic parties.

Baseball backstop built.

One hundred yards rustic fence built, and all fencing stained.

Twenty-five pounds grass seed used in reconditioning lawn.

Barricade built across driveway at west end.

Six hundred and eighty-five perennial flowering plants, 453 trees, and 628 shrubs planted. 1,750 trees and shrubs pruned.

Parking of cars continues to be the most difficult problem that we have to deal with. The congestion will be greatly relieved as soon as the old refreshment building is removed. We are still awaiting decision of the Council regarding this proposal.

An additional rustic summer house was built and placed on the Island, making three in all.

ST. GEORGE'S ISLAND ZOO: The construction of a "Dinosaur Garden", an area on which life-size models of prehistoric animals constructed in reinforced concrete, is in course of development at the west end of the island, this being a project of the Calgary Zoological Society. The area is being landscaped by this Department to, as near as possible, resemble the supposed appearance of the habitat of these animals at the time they were in existence. To date three of these animals have been built on the site, one specimen of *Triceratops billi*, and a group of two *Ceratopsaurus nasicornis*. During the winter specimens small enough to be transported to the Island, are being made under cover--such as turtles, two-toed horses, etc.

Specimens have remained in excellent health and the death rate has remained low throughout the year. While additions during the year have not been numerous, yet they have been of an interesting description. From the San Diego Zoo were received a fine collection of birds and monkeys, and antelope, pelicans, cranes, etc. were received from various Canadian points. Natural increase was again fairly satisfactory, including as it did, fallow deer, silver foxes, wolves, coonistles, etc. Nine blue peafowl were raised. As in previous years these birds did not commence to lay till late in the year. However, the fine weather experienced in the fall of this year was all in their favour.

ST. GEORGE'S ISLAND ZOO: (Cont'd)

Feeding has been carried out as economically as possible. In addition, we have utilized lawn mowings, hay, greenstuff of various kinds, tree prunings, etc., as they have been available from the several parks, and these have provided valuable foodstuffs and helped to keep the cost of feeding to a minimum.

Attendance at the Park and Zoo during the year was very heavy, and the various improvements carried out during 1935 appeared to meet with general approval. The year was notable for the large number of school classes that were conducted through the Zoo. Every effort was made to co-operate with the teachers and thus make the time spent at the Zoo both interesting and instructive.

The following improvements made during the year:-

Raising of heating plant in Tropical Animal House above flood level.

Fencing repaired, balance of old cedar posts that were beginning to rot replaced with steel posts.

Signs on pens replaced with standard type giving common name, Latin name, and habitat of bird or animal.

Construction of model buildings for white rat colony.

Painting of all buildings.

New 4-section pond for pelicans, cranes, and waterfowl is now under construction.

Calgary's first house replastered on the inside and fitted up as a First Aid Station and Office.

While the Tropical Animal Building constructed last year functions well, yet through lack of other accommodation it has become overcrowded. The caretaker has submitted a plan for a new building which is urgently needed. It is proposed to proceed with the construction of this building as soon as permission has been granted to demolish the old refreshment building, that the material from that building may be utilized. The new building will be built east of the present winter building, and will provide for the storage of hay, straw, ~~meat~~, etc., winter quarters for pelicans, cranes, and all waterfowl, and any other specimens that require little artificial heat. As suggested, the building would be similar in appearance to the other building constructed last year, it will have no floor but contain a well and pump with small pond for waterfowl. A simple heating apparatus can be constructed by the Parks Department itself at small cost.

RILEY PARK: 3,360 trees, and 2,716 shrubs pruned. 107 shrubs in park transplanted. Removed 9 dead trees. Forked in 22 loads of manure on shrubbery borders. Planted 10,030 annual flowering plants. Trenched and prepared 4 new flower beds (720 sq.ft.) using 10 loads manure and 8 loads loam. Planted 600 perennial flowering plants. Reconditioned (sodded) 460 sq.ft. lawn. Surfaced paths with 32 cu. yards of gravel. Repaired swimming pool. Laid 498 feet of wooden curbing.  
Expenditure..... \$1,422.50      Relief labor.....10,848 hours.

CRESCENT PARK: Transplanted 65 trees and 134 shrubs in park. Forked shrubbery borders. Lowered high bank on east shrubbery border, result of soil drifting, subsoil replaced with loam and manure, preparations made for replanting. Boulevard strip along fence also lowered, 426 cu. yards of soil removed. Lawn toppedressed with 18 loads manure. Ploughed and graded 6,095 sq. yards in readiness for seeding to lawn. Dilapidated sections of fence repaired. Installed 660 feet of 1½ inch b.c.pipe, making possible the seeding of an additional 3 acres of lawn.  
Expenditure..... \$564.89      Relief labor.....7,017 hours.

SOUTH MOUNT ROYAL PARK: The Amazon statue, originally in front of the Public Library in Memorial Park had to be removed from that site when the I.O.D.E.War Memorial was erected. For some considerable time no suitable site appeared to be available, nor were there means to provide a suitable base. Some tinal stone left over after the erection of the new Public Building was given to the Department by the contractors when the building was completed. During the winter 1933-34 a piece of this stone was modelled into a suitable base. South Mount Royal Park, after its development provided the site, and the statue was placed in the centre of this area. However, we were apparently unfortunate in our choice of location, for the statue has been mutilated and disfigured beyond repair by vandals.  
8,160 annuals planted. 14 loads loam, 6 loads of manure used in new flower beds. Continued construction of paths.

Expenditure..... \$338.18      Relief labor.....3,017 hours.

ELBOW BOULEVARD PARK: 101 trees, 384 shrubs pruned, 2 dead trees removed. Perennial flower beds cleared, trenched, and replanted. 6,461 annuals planted. 240 lineal feet rustic fence built on either side of path leading to suspension bridge to stop short-cutting.  
Expenditure..... \$387.36      Relief labor.....2,483 hours.

MEMORIAL PARK: 64 trees, and 622 shrubs pruned. 18,338 annuals and 56 perennials planted. Perennial plantings were not up to their usual standard, but annuals did remarkably well, particularly in view of adverse weather conditions. We were particularly happy in some of our color combinations and these seemed to give particular pleasure to the public. Worthy of mention was the extensive use of purple Verbena venosa, also a pale yellow Antirrhinum interspersed through plantings of scarlet Geranium. 8 loads of manure used on flower beds. 19 loads of manure used for mulching. 32 cu. yards crushed brick spread on paths.  
Expenditure..... \$ 560.64 Relief labor.....6,037 hours.

SOUTH CALGARY PARK: 20 trees, 90 shrubs planted. Grading at north-east corner commenced. Topographical survey made and contour plan prepared. Strip 200 feet wide ploughed at west end. Water connection to main made and stand pipe installed.

ROSEVALE PARK: General maintenance. Due to the very dry season and lack of facilities for watering it was deemed inadvisable to proceed with the development of this park. 274 trees, 511 shrubs pruned, 5 dead trees removed.

TUXEDO PARK: Grading of east area continued; approximately 2,000 cu. yards of earth moved. 335 trees and 146 shrubs pruned.

Built concrete checker board, made and painted checkers. This proved wonderfully popular. Re-erected drinking fountain (previously destroyed). Rendered first aid to 80 cases of accidents, etc.

BANKVIEW PLOT: General maintenance.  
Expenditure..... \$ 5.86 Relief labor..... 208 hours.

R.N.W.M.POLICE PLOT: 2 large spruce trees removed from City Hall Garden planted behind Memorial Stone.  
Expenditure..... \$ .80 Relief labor..... 68 hours.

BALMORAL CIRCUS: Flower beds remade and enlarged. 3,900 annuals planted. The fourth and last remaining quarter of this area to be developed was trenched 2 feet deep, heavily manured, 28 cu. yards manure and 320 cu. yards fill (hailed from Crescent Park) used. Total area 1,050 sq. yards.  
Expenditure..... \$ 189.91 Relief labor.... 3,947 hours.

ELBOW PARK CAR LOOP: 126 lineal feet wooden curbing laid. Boulevard lowered, 180 cu. yards soil removed and used for top-dressing at Cartier Park.

RIDEAU BIRD SANCTUARY: Pruned 96 trees.  
Expenditure.....\$ 5.20 Relief labor.....154 hours.

60 trees, 75 shrubs planted. Trees and shrubs cultivated and refuse removed.

It is the intention to develop this as a sunken rock garden with a lawn space in the bottom. A concrete wall 131 feet long 4 feet deep had to be removed in the course of making these improvements. 22 cu. yards manure and 26 cu. yards rock used.

1st Street, 18th Avenue E:- 768 annuals planted. Trenched front portion, removed rocks and gravel and replaced with loam from S. Calgary Park rink. Built and stained 66 lineal feet rustic fence. Dug 55 holes for trees and shrubs.

MEMORIAL DRIVE:

Sunnyside Section: 3,640 square yards seeded to lawn. 2,845 square yards prepared for seeding. 156 cu. yards fill made. 670 lineal feet pathway gravelled. 740 trees, 465 shrubs pruned.

Central Section: Footpaths graded from near north end of Centre Street Bridge along hillside eastwards, terminating at the summit of 3rd Street East; these paths have proved very popular with people living in Mt. Pleasant, giving them easy access to the down town area. 230 trees, 375 shrubs planted in extension of the planting previously made westwards from Langevin Bridge on the north side of drive. Kiwanis Club assisted with this planting. 565 tree holes dug in readiness for planting.

WESTMOUNT BOULEVARD: Due to the fact that the island boulevard had been constructed by making a very shallow fill on the old road bed, the 103 lilac bushes that were planted at the time of construction were fast deteriorating, these were lifted, excavations 3 feet wide and 3 feet deep made, gravel removed and replaced with loam and manure, and lilacs replanted.

COSTE RESIDENCE: These grounds were in a terribly neglected condition when this Department was instructed to give them some attention. The place was over-run with weeds and many of the trees and shrubs were dying from drought. The place was thoroughly cleaned up and repeatedly soaked and dead trees and shrubs removed. The museum specimens were moved from St. George's Island and placed in the building, a suitable relief worker being placed in charge to arrange and care for them.

The older children were greatly interested in softball. Basketball was also a popular game with girls of 16 and under. Volleyball was introduced for the first time at this playground. Reed weaving and raffia work proved interesting to the smaller children, as did also sewing cards, embroidery, soap carving, and other simple handicrafts.

Victoria School Playground: Miss Brown reported that there were 26 reed baskets made by her small children, some of them displaying excellent workmanship. Nineteen tea trays were also completed. Raffia work also proved popular, baskets, whips, cuff-protectors, bandeaus, and belts being made in various colors. Much interest was shown in football and basketball by the older children.

Bridgeland Playground: Miss Gerlitz' playground won the trophy for the highest standing in track and field events for the first time in its history. Five teams from this playground participated in the playoffs, the Intermediate boys winning the trophy for the third time in succession. The attendance at times was very large, 150 to 200 children often being on the playground at one time. Next to softball, basketball and football were the most popular games. Volleyball did not prove popular. There was a demand for horse-shoes. Fifty reed and raffia baskets were made, some of the neatest work being done by boys.



PLAYGROUNDS: (Cont'd)

Riley Playground: Mr. Dann reports that baseball teams were organized as usual and games played as per schedule, with the other playgrounds. Due to continued heat in July it was impossible to get teams in several divisions. Two of our teams worked their way to the finals, but went down to defeat at that stage. In reed and raffia work great interest was manifest, so much so that greater quantities of reed and raffia could have been used. There was also a continual demand for sewing cards.

Maintenance and Improvements:

Elbow Swimming Pool Grounds: An open-air checker board was constructed and proved immensely popular both with children and adults. It is hoped that it will be possible to add this feature to other playgrounds during the coming season.

Central Rotary Playground: The grading of this playground was completed early in the year, 2,690 cu. yards of dirt removed, and later, was completely fenced and fully equipped through the generosity of the Rotary Club at a cost to the Club of seven hundred and fifty dollars (\$750.00) for material. The Club also provided lights operated by a time clock. This ground was seeded with crested wheat and rye grass. New manhole for water service constructed.

Old Victoria Playground: The shelter was destroyed by vandals and will not be replaced as the new Victoria Rotary Playground will now serve this district.

Mt. Pleasant Rotary Recreation Ground: 60 feet of  $\frac{3}{4}$  inch water pipe installed.

New Victoria Rotary Playground: This is a very fine and well situated playground site, 1.38 acres in extent, serving a large and thickly populated district to the east and west of the Elbow River. The work of grading was completed and was then fenced, equipped, and lighted, the cost of \$750.00 again being borne by the Rotary Club.

Mewata Park: It is proposed to change the site of this playground to a new location in the park and to re-arrange the apparatus.

Sunnyside Playground: A fence was erected along the north side. The area was seeded and a good sod is now established.

Tuxedo Park: Wading pool fence painted, (paint provided by Kiwanis Club). The equipment on this park is in a very delapidated condition, and it is the intention to reconstruct it during the coming year.

Valleyfield Playground: The apparatus formerly at the Millican Picnic Ground was moved to this location.

Killarney Park: Swings in dangerous condition; entirely new set required. Baseball backstop built.

Ogden Park: Wading pool shelter and fence painted, (paint supplied by Kiwanis Club).

St. George's Island: Wading pool shelter and fence painted, (paint supplied by Kiwanis Club).

PLAYGROUNDS: (Cont'd)

Considerable interest was displayed in our playground work by visitors from outside points, who were eager to establish a similar system or to improve on what they had in their home towns.

It is the opinion of the Parks Superintendent that a good deal of the destruction and vandalism that takes place in the parks from time to time is perpetrated by lads who have just passed the school age. Present conditions make it impossible for these lads to obtain employment, and their ranks are constantly being augmented. It is felt by the Department that an effort should be made to give these lads some useful occupation in the form of sports facilities to occupy at least a part of their leisure time. In 1930 the Parks Department organized softball teams for such lads in a few locations. This has now developed into what is known as the City Wide League.

Inglewood Community Rink: Addition to dressing room built. Water connection made and service extended to dressing room. Rink enclosed with 10 foot close board fence.

South Calgary Community Rink: Building erected. Rink site levelled and enlarged.

Mission Athletic Ground Rink: New site for this rink graded on extreme north side of block, to prevent flooding of lane during thaws if possible. A cut and fill of approximately 5 feet required.

Parkhill Athletic Ground Rink: Grading of rink site completed in conjunction with football ground.

South Calgary Park Rink: Rink extended 50 by 100 feet; 560 cu.yards loam removed and used as topdressing at Cartier and Roxborough Parks.

Roxborough Park Rink: New site graded for this rink, 140 cu. yards of earth moved.

Killarney Park Rink: New hockey enclosure built. Grading completed.

Royal Sunalta Recreation Ground: Rink enclosure and building moved to newly graded site above bank. Water service extended to new location.

King George, 18th Ave., 9th St. N.W.: A new site was selected for this rink at the request of local residents.

Victoria Rotary Playground Rink: The whole of the open area on this playground was flooded for the first time and has proved immensely popular.

Manchester Rink: This rink was enlarged.

East Grey Community Rink: A new shelter was constructed on a site excavated on the hillside, the material being provided by the community.

Mewata Park Rink: Owing to the filling of the depression in the north east corner of the baseball ground it has been possible to considerably enlarge this rink.

Eau Claire Recreation Ground Rink: The local community organization has abandoned the operation of this rink and has asked the Parks Department to take it over.

Public Market Rink, 4th Ave., 3rd St. N.E: Site graded and new rink constructed.

SHAGANAPPI PARK MUNICIPAL GOLF COURSE: Two tournaments were held on the course this season, the City Amateur Championship and a Field Day under the auspices of the Alberta Golf Association. In the City Amateur Event, 84 men and 17 women competed. The Field Day drew 25 entrants. The major event of Calgary golf, the City Amateur Championship was held on May 17th, 18th, 24th, and 25th. It is the fourth time the Championship has been held on our course, the previous years being 1923, 1927, and 1931. Due to continuous fine weather the course was well patronized, there being only one bad week end. The prolonged dry weather was, however, very harmful to the course, and emphasized the very great need there is for the extension of water on the course, if it is to be kept in a reasonable condition, and such as will attract players. There was much complaint during the summer regarding dust.

The following work was done:- 4 new mat frames made. 6 cu. yards rocks removed from fairways. Fairways topdressed with 8 cu. yards loam. All greens resurfaced with new oiled sand, (21 barrels oil, 70 cu. yards sand used). We were very fortunate in discovering a seam of very excellent sand in close proximity to the course. Sodded approaches to greens by removing 76 cu. yards earth and laying 3,867 square feet turf. Removed sod from all shrubbery groups. Pruned 933 trees and 466 shrubs. Planted 45 trees. Renovated fence with 524 new posts. Oiled (2 coats) log hut. Much new equipment required.

MEWATA PARK: The softball diamond was in use on Sunday afternoons and practically every night, and large crowds attended the games. Grading of park continued throughout the year. 460 cu. yards of earth, 252 cu. yards gravel moved. 45 spruce trees planted, 12 caragana planted outside ballground fence. 80 cu. feet  $\frac{3}{4}$  inch pipe laid, extending water service to softball diamond. Expenditure..... \$ 247.16. Relief labor..... 8,466 hours.

MEWATA STADIUM: This area was very intensively used,--football games three nights per week, practicing all other nights, athletic meets on five Saturdays, ten High School Rugby games, one Boys' Work Board Athletic Meet, one Senior Athletic Meet and Highland Games, thirty-two Soccer games, eight Senior Rugby games, eight High School Rugby games, one Parks' Department Sports Day, and 4 Athletic Clubs Training. At the pro Rugby games there was an average attendance of 4,000 people.

MEWATA STADIUM: (Cont'd)

There has been excellent cooperation on the part of the Commission with this Department, and I have been regularly invited to attend its meetings, which has been mutually helpful.

Grading on north side between track and fence completed and area seeded. Running track patched. Removal of gravel from area behind grandstand completed and this space loamed and seeded.

HILLHURST ATHLETIC PARK: 234 trees, 187 shrubs pruned. East side fence, blown down in gale of November 19th, rebuilt. New showers installed.

EAU CLAIRE RECREATION GROUNDS: Levelling completed, 1,903 cu. yards earth moved, the area levelled during year being 275x250 ft.

Expenditure..... \$ 2.40. Relief labor.....272 hours.

BRIDGELAND ATHLETIC GROUNDS: Grading continued throughout the year. Building previously moved to football ground east of General Hospital by request of the community organization was taken down and re-erected as a dressing room at these grounds. 265 feet of 2 inch pipe laid, extending water service to rink.

Expenditure..... \$ 207.23. Relief labor.....6,894 hours.

OGDEN PARK: Buildings repaired. 40 trees, 70 shrubs planted. 500 holes prepared for planting of trees and shrubs. Paths gravelled. Water service repaired and extended. Drinking fountain installed. Rink maintained.

Expenditure..... \$ 28.25. Relief labor.....3,167 hours.

MILLICAN RECREATION GROUNDS: Repaired and enlarged buildings. Maintained rink.

Relief labor..... 890 hours.

VALLEYFIELD RECREATION GROUNDS: Building completed. Light poles installed. Maintained rink.

Relief labor.....1,336 hours.



EARL GREY RECREATION GROUNDS: Site for new building graded, (200 cu. yards dirt moved). New dressing room constructed. Expenditure..... \$ 39.45. Relief labor.....1,016 hours.

ROYAL SUNALTA RECREATION GROUNDS: The lease, held by the local organization, was cancelled by request, and the Parks Department resumed complete control of this property.

MOUNT PLEASANT ROTARY RECREATION GROUNDS: 408 trees, 628 shrubs pruned. Two new tennis courts constructed and fenced with material purchased very cheaply from the Prince's Island Tennis Club (now defunct). Surfaced paths with 34 cu. yards gravel. Planted 297 trees and 380 shrubs. Ploughed and prepared site for bowling greens. (See also, Playgrounds, Page 20) Expenditure..... \$ 587.61. Relief labor.....3,725 hours.

ROXBOROUGH RECREATION GROUNDS: Resurfaced tennis courts. Painted tennis court fence. Relief labor.....154 hours.

BANKVIEW GIRL GUIDES' CLUB HOUSE GROUNDS: These grounds were cleaned, refuse removed, levelled, seeded to grass, hedge of 200 caragana planted, 290 feet fence built, grass seed and material for fence provided by the Guides. Expenditure..... \$ 2.95. Relief labor.....248 hours.

CALGARY TENNIS COURTS, SUNALTA PARK: In response to the request of the Club operating these courts the old concrete-surfaced courts, which were quite useless because of their condition, were torn up and resurfaced with shale. Sewer and water service, which have been a continual source of annoyance and expense, were reconstructed and placed below frost depth. 84 cu. yards of earth were removed from the strip within the north fence. This soil proved to be good loam and therefore was useful to the Department. 292 feet of fencing was reconstructed. With the exception of relief labor and hauling of loam these improvements were financed by the Club. Expenditure..... \$ 19.36. Relief labor.....635 hours.

BOW VALLEY BOWLING GREENS: The sloping boulevard space in front of these greens graded, built up with rock work and will be planted with suitable material in the spring. 7,680 square feet rockery built, 36 cu. yards stone used. Expenditure..... \$ 2.05. Relief labor.....120 hours.

COL. WALKER BOWLING GREENS: An area near the south entrance to St. George's Island has been cleared, ploughed and graded, wooden-lined ditch installed and the area fenced. Relief labor and the necessary teams were furnished by the Department, all material supplied by the above named Club. Expenditure..... \$ 151.22. Relief labor.....790 hours.

BOULEVARDS: The only tree pruning it was possible to do on the boulevards last winter was in the following districts,--Parkview, Rideau, Roxborough, Elbow Park, and the Mission. No pruning has been done so far this winter. A number of trees were uprooted by the storm of November 19th.

All boulevards lowered during 1935 were forked, levelled, and seeded; total area 37,200 square feet. 6,280 square feet boulevard lowered, levelled, and seeded during the season. 20,105 square feet boulevard lowered in readiness for reseeding. 129 trees, 50 shrubs planted. 57 trees removed because of sewer trouble. 33 dead trees removed. 5 trees destroyed by storms. 3 trees removed to make way for crossings. 43 Poplar trees removed from Sunnyside Boulevard and replaced with lilacs. 89 trees headed back. 4,768 trees and shrubs cultivated. 45 cu. yards soil taken from boulevards. 12 cu. yards loam used for renovating. Boulevards cut twice during the season.

CEMETERIES, GENERAL: At the present time there are approximately 4,700 grave spaces still available, 1,000 of which are in the Field of Honor, leaving available for general use some 3,700. At the present time we are using approximately 650 grave spaces every year, this means that in about five years the whole available space in Burnsland Cemetery will have been disposed of. Under these circumstances it appears to me that it is quite time that some thought should be given to the proper development of the new cemetery site.

On Decoration Day, August 30th, flags were placed on all soldiers' graves. A platform was erected and all arrangements were made for the service. Men were on duty to direct traffic and keep order, also to lower and raise flags during the service.

Services were held during the year by the Elks and I.O.O.F., assistance being given on these occasions.

There were several complaints about vases and flowers being stolen during the year. This usually happened when the staff was off duty. If plot owners placing out flowers on plots would see that they are properly secured it would save a lot of trouble, as during strong winds flowers, particularly everlasting ones, which are used to a considerable extent, and even in some cases the receptacles, are blown from the graves. It has actually been possible after a period of windy weather to clean a whole load of flower devices of various kinds from the fence line of the cemetery.

All tree borders forked over in the spring, watered and cultivated during season, much of the watering being done in the evenings owing to drought and water restrictions. Trees and shrubs were planted where required and replacements made for those winter-killed.

Tree holes have been dug in vacant places ready for spring planting. Thirty rose bushes planted.

All boulevard trees and shrubs were pruned and the borders were forked, cultivated, and watered during the season.

Trees and shrubs planted and replacements made where required. 77 cu. yards old hotbed manure used on cemetery plots.

Due to the heavy snowfall of the winter 1935-36, much work was entailed in keeping the cemetery roads open.

CEMETERIES, GENERAL: (Cont'd). Many of the borders of herbaceous perennials have become exhausted and have been deteriorating rapidly during the past few years. Commencement made to rehabilitate these borders by lifting old stock, trenching ground to a depth of three feet, incorporating heavy dressings of manure and replanting with young, vigorous stock.

Trees and shrubs where crowded, transplanted within the borders and groups to fill gaps or for new plantings as shown under statistics.

I would like to take this opportunity to pay tribute to the excellent services rendered by many of the relief recipients working in the cemeteries, these men have taken great interest in the work allotted to them. In particular, Mr. Walton, who lives in the vicinity of the Burnsland Cemetery, deserves special mention.

UNION CEMETERY: 639 feet, 2"x4" creosoted wooden curbing laid on the main driveway near main entrance.

900 square feet turf laid to restore worn-out verges to flower borders in same location. Seven new steel 30-inch culverts used to replace old wooden ones that had caved in on east driveway. Three inches of finely screened gravel spread on pathway from the main entrance to the north end of nursery, total superficial area,-- 1,800 square feet. Discarded blocks of asphalt removed from city streets used on the hairpin bend on main driveway by way of experiment. The keeping of this turn in condition has always been a problem due to the cutting out of the gravel by cars, and the only solution is to have this section of the driveway paved. 800 square feet of rock wall at Section G that had become badly infested with weeds reconstructed and rebuilt. All other rock walls cultivated and watered as required and vacant areas suitably planted, but owing to the shortage of skilled labor and drought these rock walls did not get the careful attention that they needed. 5,814 square feet of flower borders along main driveway trenched, fertilized, and partly replanted. All flower borders received necessary attention of cultivating, fertilizing, and watering. New fence posts erected to complete the fence on the north boundary of Union Cemetery. A new bier with rubber-tired wheels constructed for moving bodies from the vault. This has proved a great labor-saving device. Three loads of tin cans, jars, etc. removed from plots at the end of the season. Fertilizer was spread and raked over Sections M, G, H, and D. All trees and shrubs on private plots pruned and cultivated. Fertilizer and loam spread over 7,744 square yards on west slope and made ready for seeding. 600 square feet of turf laid along the border 4 feet wide. A new garage built at back of the cemetery cottage for truck supplied last spring and heater installed. The truck, although an old one, has given good service, and has fully justified the little expenditure made on it. 8 new steel culverts are required in the roads on the east side of the vault and main drive. 100 feet of 1 inch pipe laid in extension of water service. Man hole on main drive reconstructed. 32 large trees on west slope removed. Expenditure.....\$6,192.13. Relief labor..... 41,490 hours.

BURNSLAND CEMETERY: Tree holes are being dug on Section G (Field of Honor) on the area to be used for ceremonial purposes. This Ceremonial space was graded and prepared for seeding. 800 feet 2 inch and 1,800 feet of 1 inch pipe laid in extending water service. 300 feet of storm sewer laid and manhole 4 ft. 6 inches x 5 feet built on the south side of cemetery to drain off storm water. This completes the construction of storm sewer commenced some years ago and which now extends from the McLeod Trail to the exhausted gravel pit on the east side of Burnsland Cemetery.

10 new rose beds prepared and planted on ends of blocks.

Expenditure..... \$ 3,403.85. Relief labor.....31,840 hours.

ROMAN CATHOLIC CEMETERY: The main entrance to this cemetery has been designed with a vehicle turn immediately within the gateway, in the centre of which is a circular bed enclosed in a concrete curb and with a concrete curb on the outer side of the driveway. This curb is 6 inches by 1 foot and its total length 300 feet. 360 cu. yards of fill used to bring the main driveway up to grade. This was surfaced with 8,959 square feet of coarse gravel 6 inches deep. The driveway needs surfacing with fine gravel to complete its construction. Flower bed at entrance trenched and planted with annuals. Tree borders trenched on west side from Section F to the extreme south-east corner and fertilized. 60 trees and 251 shrubs planted and borders cultivated on north and west sides. All trees and shrubs pruned. Grading continued during winter months; 566 cu. yards of dirt wheeled into the depression. This is now nearing completion on Sections A,B,C, and D, and should be ready for seeding in 1937. Mulch was spread outside of fence on west side to prevent soil drifting. Cutbank adjoining St. Mary's Cemetery was graded off on south and west sides, the earth being used for fill in new cemetery. Approximately 1,800 square yards of land on east side of new cemetery graded off and earth used to bring roadway in the cemetery to grade. Considerable improvement has thereby been effected. All areas that have been graded should be mulched to prevent the soil drifting. 300 feet 2 inch and 156 feet of 1 inch pipe laid in extending water service. 25 burials have been made since date of opening, -- July 1934.

Expenditure.....\$ 1,236.95. Relief labor.....28,601 hours.

CHINESE CEMETERY: The whole of this cemetery cleaned, graded, loamed, and seeded to grass, the work being done by Chinese unemployed under direction of this Department. Unfortunately, no water being available the grass did not germinate.

NURSERIES: General. The abundant moisture of the late winter and early spring produced a splendid germination and growth of all young stock, and there is considerable material now available for lining out for the now much-depleted nurseries. All available ground was prepared for this purpose during the fall by digging and fertilizing.

Expenditure ..... \$1,303.45. Relief labor.....6,220 hours.

Parks Department Nursery. 5,325 tree and shrub cuttings were made and planted. The total number of cuttings planted in both nurseries being 19,975. 52,459 perennials were raised from seed and cuttings on hotbeds. 2,150 trees and shrubs were transplanted. The following nursery stock was used for permanent planting in the various parks and cemeteries:- 7,841 trees and shrubs; 18,470 perennials; 36 vines. At the present time there are 35,434 seedling plants in stock in frames. Quantities of tree and shrub seed was collected. Value of stock in nurseries at present time,-- \$13,041.17.

Glenmore Nursery: A tract of ground was prepared for planting on land adjoining the Glenmore Dam by the Water Works Department and planted by the Parks Department with nursery stock as follows:- 14,650 tree and shrub cuttings.

Burnsland Cemetery Nursery: 170 square feet of turf sent to Riley Park from Section A.

GREENHOUSES: 100,000 bedding plants supplied. *Verbena venosa* was the plant feature to the greatest possible extent in last year's floral displays.

BURNSLAND GRAVEL PIT: The portion of land that has been reclaimed was again used by several men on relief for growing vegetables. The balance of the land was cultivated and kept free from weeds. Gravel in stock December 30th,-- 118 cu. yards. Sand and gravel used during the year as follows:-

Seventy-two trees supplied and planted at Mt. Royal School for Parent Teachers' Association.

Grounds at Junior Red Cross Hospital cleaned, dead trees removed, all trees and shrubs pruned, all refuse removed and whole area thoroughly watered.

Floral displays made at the several flower shows.

Assistance given to Sunshine and Salvation Army.

Relief labor..... 104 hours.

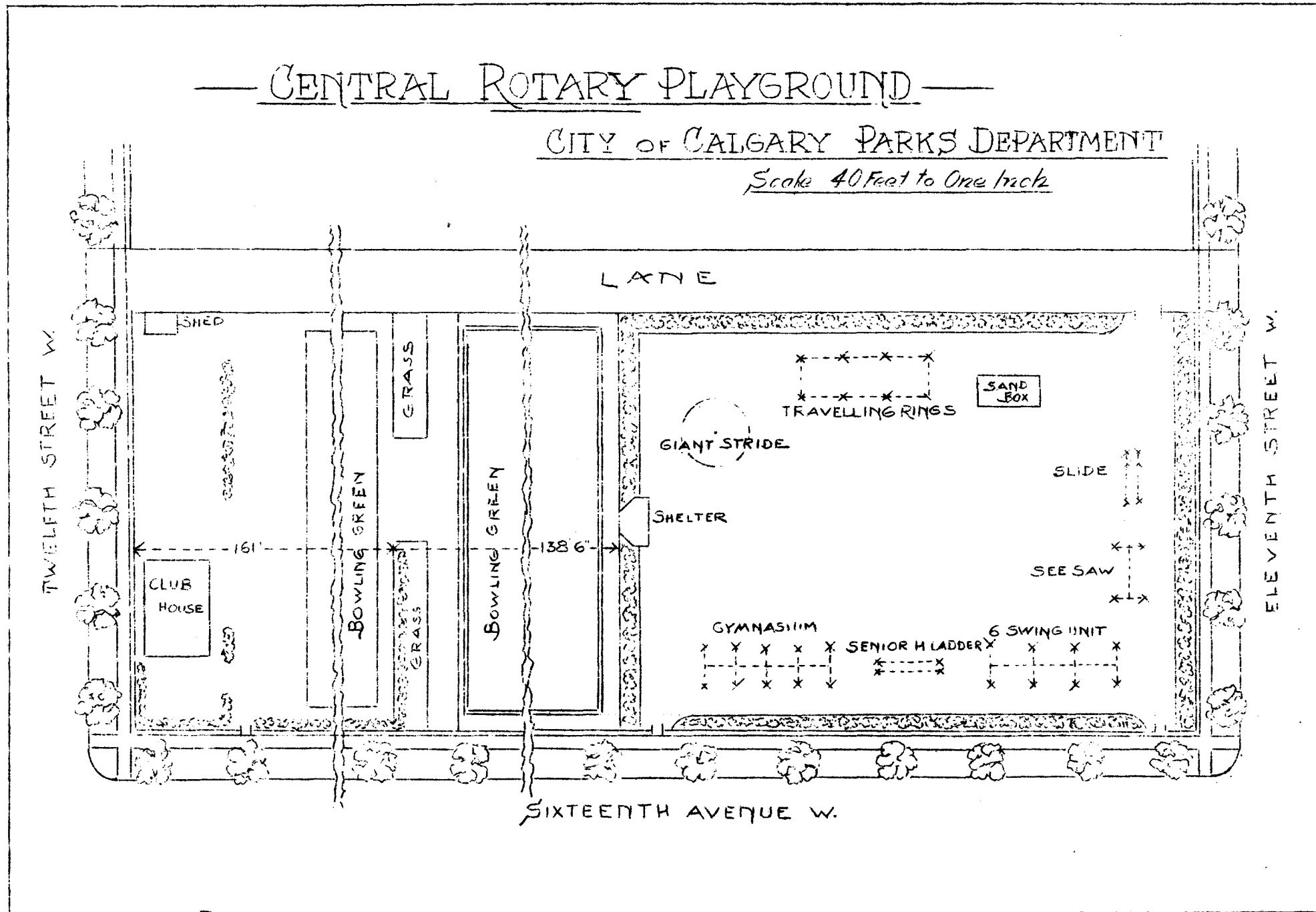
