ANNUAL REPORT 1938

To His Worship the Mayor, Commissioner, and City Council:

Gentlemen:

I have the honour to present my report of the activities of the Parks Department for the year ending December 31st, 1938.

Our park area continues to increase and the demand of the public on our park facilities grows with each succeeding year. To give some idea of the development that has taken place in this particular Department I would call your attention to the fact that the system has grown from 522.53 acres to 1,286.07 acres in the last 25 years, from 2 horses and buggies, 1 horse and cart, and half a dozen hand mowers to 3 automobiles, 4 trucks, 90 hand mowers, 10 power mowers, 3 three-unit gang mowers and other modern equipment of various kinds. Many branches have been added to the activities of the Department, not the least important being the Municipal Golf Course, childrens' playgrounds, skating and hockey rinks, Zoo and civic nursery and experimental grounds. The increase in development of new areas has in recent years

The increase in development of new areas has in recent years been due to some extent to the use of relief labour but, unfortunately, the amount of this relief labour made available to this Department has been steadily decreasing during the last two or three years. Sufficient of this class of labour is available during the winter months when it has to be used for development work, but, during the summer, there is not nearly enough for proper maintenance, and this problem is becoming more acute each year. The Department was very severely handicapped last year by the fact that there was a strike of this labour during the early spring season, the most critical time so far as the work of this Department is concerned. To carry on the essential work it was necessary to hire a certain amount of labour during the period of the strike and for some time afterward over and above what would have been used in the ordinary course. This, together with several other items that were not provided for in the annual appropriation, was the cause of the slight over expenditure that occured last year.

New Areas Acquired: The following plots have been placed in charge of this Department during the past year .-

A triangular plot at the intersection of 8th. St. West and Premier Way.

Lots 14 to 20, Block 12, Plan 5584R, Section 4, situated at the intersection of 39th. Ave. and 4th. St. S.W., petitioned for by local residents for playground purposes.

The most westerly 200 feet of the playground at the Sunnyside Bungalow School was placed in the control of the Parks Department to be developed as a community playground.

The north-east portion, approximately 150 feet square, of the grounds of the Central High School was placed in the control of the Parks Department for a similar purpose. Lots 16 to 30, Plan 3150, 20th. Ave., between 9th. & 10th. Street N.W., to be developed as a playground and known as King George Recreation Ground.

That part of Lot 34, west of the east 25 feet, of Block 13, Plan 2448-0 Section 21, at 9a Street and 1st. Ave., Sunnyside, petitioned for by local residents, to be developed as an ornamental plot.

Weather: Whilst the precipitation for the whole year was very much less than that of 1937, the greater part of this fell during the growing season and was fairly regularly distributed throughout that period, and thus growth appeared to be quite normal as compared with the previous year. It was during the autumn months that the greatest difference occured and by the end of the year the moisture content of the soil was extremely low. The frost-free period extended from May 12th., when the minimum temperature was 31 degrees F. to October 12th., when there was a drop to 29 degrees F. The very favourable weather conditions of the early part of the year, with no extreme fluctuations of temperature, steady cold and a fair snow covering resulted later in an abundant display of blossom and heavy crops of fruit on all flowering and berry-bearing shrubs. January was unusually mild, but still sufficiently cold as to cause no concern as to its effect on vegetation. Severe weather prevailed throughout February till the last week when it became unseasonably mild. At times during the month the cold was intense. Both temperature and precipitation were slightly above normal during March. April was comparatively mild with fair precipitation in the form of snow. May was cool with heavy rainfall. In June the temperatures were normal with fair precipit. The precipitation in July was light, but somewhat better in August. September, October, November and December were abnormally mild and abnormally dry. The only really cold weather in the closing months of the year was that experienced during the last week of December.

<u>Trees & Shrubs</u>: After many years of experimental work one is reluctantly forced to the conclusion that the species of trees that can be grown in this climate and at this altitude are extremely few in number, being confined principally to the several species of Poplar, Birch, Green Ash and Elm. As street trees, Poplars are proving extremely unsatisfactory. These are being gradually removed and others substituted.

ST. GEORGE'S ISLAND PARK:

The 4th. Calgary (Elk's Own) Boy Scout Troop again conducted a First Aid Station at the Island and report as follows:

48. Number of Scout hours; 714. Total days station open; " " Cases; Last day open, Oct. 16th. 81. 299. hours

First day open, May 8th. Last day open, Oct. 16th. While the number of cases show a decided increase over 1937 the majority were of a minor nature, only two ambulance cases being reported.

This team of Scouts won the Dominion Championship for First

Aid open to any five boys or girls in Canada. Estimates were prepared for improving the Island driveway but the cost of surfacing and oiling - \$2,715.00, was considered too great an expenditure to make. The baseball diamond was intensively used throughout the season and ttracted large crowds of spectators, - as many as 400 at times. A shelter for picnic parties at the extreme east end of the

A shelter for picnic parties at the extreme east end of the

Island would be a very desirable acquisition. I regret to have to report that several of the fine old trees that have constituted one of the most interesting features of the Island, being the largest and probably the oldest in the city, have had to be removed, decay having rendered them dangerous. The roads were surfaced in places with gravel from the river bed.

The slopes bordering the driveway have been riprapped with boulders and forty-six trees and shrubs and 30 vines were planted. Two hundred feet of rustic fencing was constructed. A large trapped culvert was laid through the embankment at the east end as an emergency outlet should the Island again be flooded.

Parking of cars is becoming a more and more serious problem each year. Some additional space near the pavilion was gravelled and will accomodate some 35 cars but this has had no appreciable effect on the congestion. If the Zoological Society had proceeded with its under-taking as expressed to the City Commissioners to entirely remove the old refreshment building the problem would, for the time being at least, have been solved to some extent. I would strongly urge that I be given authority to remove this building. Any material that is worth salvaging might be used in constructing the suggested shelter at the east and at the east end.

The gates erected at the West end of the Island by the Zoological Society are the cause of very numerous complaints on account of their narrowness.

ST. GEORGE'S ISLAND ZOO: During the past year the Zoological Society expended its efforts less on Dinosaur specimens and more on the improvements of the Zoo itself. Improvements made during the past year were as follows, the material being provided by the Society and labour mainly by this Department, with the exception of the Polar bear den, in which case the City provided the concrete. - Polar bear enclosure, den and pool. An 18 ft. x 28 ft. addition to winter quarter building with full-sized basement, double-boarded walls and ceiling packed with shavings. Five hundred feet iron pipe fence erected in front of animal cages to replace worn-out rustic fence. A large enclosure for wolves at the extreme east end of the Island, adjacent to the beaver pen. Eight rodent and small carnivore cages. New service building. Small tool shed and workshop. Meat store has been re-built and improvements made to most of the other storage buildings. Most of the old buildings have been painted.

The following additions have been made to the Dinosaur Garden. Two life-sized Dinosaurs have been added to the collection. A 60-ft. fossil house has been erected. This building contain some very rare and valuable specimens.

The attendance at the Zoo is steadily increasing, particularly as regards the number of classes of school children that are con-

ducted through the Zoo. A very conservative estimate places the number of children visiting the Zoo in this way at 3,000. What appeals to me as an extremely worthwhile proposal has been made by Mr. Baines, the Zoo caretaker. The following is a copy of

the letter he addressed to me on the subject. "If a Zoo is to fill its real place in our Civic life, I believe it should not only be so attractive as to draw the vast majority of our own citizens and visitors, but it must also prove of such lasting interest that they will leave only with the definite thought of returning.

How can we bring about this desirable state of affairs? It seems that, as we cannot compete either in size or elaborateness with the large Zoos; then we should aim to plan things "differently better"

with some really unique features. For a Zoo to be successful it must, of course, have specimens housed, fed and cared for in such a manner that they prove attractive to visitors. But is this enough? Obviously not, otherwise it would be merely a menagerie. Let us remember that just as Zoology is the study of the lower animals, so a Zoological Garden should be educational as well as interesting and amusing. How can we in Calgary, with our limited finances, make our Gardens and Park prove not only more popular, but almost essential in our City's educational life.

First, let us see what we have done to date. We have some 500 specimens of 150 species, housed, fed and cared for in such a manner that has given us one of the lowest death rates of any Zoo on this continent. In the main, these are housed in their correct Zoological Order. In most cases the pens are marked with the common and Latin names, also habitat of species, although, where a number of species are in one pen this falls short of being an ideal method method.

Last year some 90 classes of city and country children visited our Park in conducted parties. Every effort was made to make these tours a success, but I believe we should do more. June is the

popular month for country visits, September for city, and in many cases weather conditions either prevented or curtailed visits. I suggest we need an Educational Building that will seat 80 children on anchored benches, and in addition would contain:-Our unique map of the world showing habitat, food, habits, etc. 1. of every species in the Zoo.

Illustrated charts showing ages, speed, etc. of animals. Illustrated charts showing harmful and useful predatory birds, 2. explaining why some should be reduced in number and others left that are real friends to farmers and gardeners.

4. Illustrations or mounted specimens such as Passenger Pigeon, Heath Hen, etc. that have been exterminated by man's thoughtlessness. Other cases might include birds' eggs, insects, etc. Mounted specimens of small species that are not in Zoo could 5. 6. be added; sometimes a small specimen will arrive in a dead or dying condition, and this would be a fitting place for it. 7. Lists of Nature Study books and magazines recommended by the Public Librarian or School Board should be placed on display. Already I have the nucleus of a fine Nature Library.

8. Aquarium.

While I have only stressed the Zoo end such a building would be equally useful in connection with other Park features, for instance:-

<u>Dinosaur Park</u>:- Life, history, habits, how models were built, etc. <u>Gardens</u>:- Displays relating to Horticulture and Arboriculture, weed and insect control charts, etc. Photos, etc., showing growth of Calgary's Parks and how they serve the public. <u>Recreation</u>:- Doubtless certain aspects could be worked in -- Totem <u>Polo</u> bistory of this and other Polos. Calgary's First House

Pole history of this and other Poles, Calgary's First House, history, photos, etc. of early townsite. Vandalism: - Surely the fact that our Dimosaur models have to be fenced with barbed wire shows that this is closely linked up with every branch of park activity. Would not this be an ideal place to give facts and figures relating to what vandalism costs Calgary every year and how much better service could be given our citizens if it were not for the cost of repairing damage done or preventing damage being done.

We might make a charge for admission for adults, children

We might make a charge for admission for adults, children being free, or have a contribution box. A visitor's book, etc. might also be in such a building. Just as we have tried to make St. George's Island one of the most interesting of places locally, let us try and make this building the most interesting building in the District. Let us see what our children can learn in such an ideal environment, - Biology, Natural History, Conservation, Climatology, Natural Resources, to say nothing of the various phases of Enter-prise work now taught in our Schools. Lectures to children and adults could be given. Local Clubs.

Lectures to children and adults could be given. Local Clubs, Lodges, Convention delegates, would, I believe, welcome it. While the above may seem elaborate and expensive to achieve, I do not think the cost need be excessive, and if it could be built or even started in 1939, I believe it would be an ideal souvenir of the Borel Visit the Royal Visit. of

Not one of the Zoos I have visited on the Pacific Coast have such a building. San Diego's Zoo is so beautifully laid out amid such surroundings that perhaps one is not needed, but most of the others, even when they apparently have unlimited finance and backing, appear depressing and dull and in some cases almost make the visitor think he is in a cage or den himself." X This is not a model but has been reconstructed with the <u>actual</u> fossilized bones and is housed in a building specially erected for the purpose. RILEY PARK: The whole area of the factor is heavily dressed with decayed manure in an effort to restore the sod which is in very poor shape. A commencement was made to develop the westerly portion of the pool into an aquatic garden by planting suitable material. The water service was extended 300 feet. SOUTH CALGARY PARK: Ninety-four thousand sq. ft. of surface was ploughed, graded and prepared for seeding. Thirty-three trees and 30 shrubs were planted. The area that has not been disturbed was burned over to destroy weeds and grass. Expenditure Labour \$ 147.51 Material 39.93 Relief labour 1,274 hours.

ROSEVALE PARK: The border along the south side of the park was trenched 3 feet deep, manured and prepared for planting next spring. A rustic fence was also erected along the same side. A new floor was laid in the Community House. The tennis courts were moved back 18 feet from the Avenue so as to provide for border planting. This new border will be filled with perennial flowering plants next season. Expenditure Labour \$ 306.03 delief labour 6,540 hours. Material 79.90 TOMKINS GARDENS: The group of trees and shrubs at the east and west ends of this plot are being gradually reduced with a view to their eventual complete removal, it being the intention to then re-design the whole area. Expenditure Labour \$ 115.16 Material 11.13 Relief labour 544 hours. TRIANGLE PARK: General maintenance. Expenditure Labour \$ 160.22 Material 11.13 Relief labour 656 hours. ELBOW PARK SWIMMING POOL GROUNDS: New booms had to be provided, the old ones having become water-logged and useless. The watchman was on duty at all times when children were using the pool. First aid for minor cuts and bruises was rendered in 75 instances. The open for minor cuts and bruises was rendered in 75 instances. The open air checker board was in great demand throughout the season. The dressing rooms are badly in need of repair, both as regards roof and floor. CARTIER PARK: Fifty-eight trees and 72 shrubs were planted and 16 cu. yds. of fertilizer used. A building was erected at the foot of the hill to provide a storage place for tools and for the accomodation of workmen. A certain amount of grading was done around this building and trees and shrubs planted. A ditch was dug to convey excess water during heavy rains to the storm sewer to prevent damage to the park. A further large area has been cleaned, dug and graded in readiness for seeding to lawn. Expenditure Labour \$ 306.32 Material 181.33 Relief labour 1,208 hours. RIDEAU PARK: General maintenance. Expenditure Labour \$ 9.85 Relief labour 48 hours. RIDEAU ROAD PLOT: Thirty shrubs and 200 perennial flowering plants were planted. Expenditure Labour \$ 43.44 Material 53.50 Relief labour 88 hours. GARDEN CRESCENT: General maintenance. Expenditure Labour \$ 36.00 Relief labour 34 hours. TALON AVENUE ROCK GARDEN: Eight hundred lineal feet of rustic fence was constructed. Expenditure Labour \$ 179.49 Material 10.00 Relief labour 1,632 hours. CITY HALL GARDEN: The fence requires completing and painting. Expenditure Labour \$ 35.75 Material Relief labour 424 hours. 5.00 ELBOW DRIVE GARDEN: Nothing was required to be done on this plot except the regular maintenance work. The floral display was again very attractive and received much favourable comment. Expenditure Labour \$ 57.09 Relief labour 144 hours. <u>CLIFF TRIANGLE</u>: Sixteen cu. yds. of manure and fertilizer was used for trees and shrubs. Two trees were transplanted from Rosevale Park. Expenditure Labour \$ 145.62 Material 11.13 Relief labour 420 hours.

RAVINE GARDENS: The trenching of the areas on either side of the steps leading to the ravine was completed, trees and shrubs previously planted were transplanted to the newly prepared sites and all vacant areas filled with new material. BANKVIEW PLOT: Very serious damage was done to the luxuriant growth of trees and shrubs in this area by children. Six trees and 16 shrubs were removed. Relief labour 104 hours. Langevin Bridge:-General maintenance. Expenditure Labour \$ 8.26 Relief labour 40 hours. Rideau Bridge:- Ten trees, 15 shrubs pruned. Expenditure Labour \$ 10.17 Relief 1 Relief labour 64 hours. ISLAND PLOTS AT STREET INTERSECTIONS & STREET ENDS: Street End, 18th. Ave. & 1st. St. East: - Sixty perennial flowering plants were planted. Relief labour 16 hours. Islands at 8th. St. W. Intersections:-General maintenance. Expenditure Labour \$ 3.16 Relief labour 48 hours. Street End, 26th. Ave. & 1st. St. West:-General maintenance. Expenditure Labour \$ 20.27 Relief labour 70 hours. 1st. Street East at Elbow River:- A water connection was made to facilitate watering of this plot. A number of shrub and tree roots removed on this hillside. Relief labour 96 hours. Expenditure Labour \$ 5.24 MEMORIAL DRIVE & WESTMOUNT BOULEVARD: General maintenance. Expenditure Labour \$ 51.43 Material 31.13 Relief labour 3,508 hours. MEWATA BOULEVARD & TRIANGLES: This is the strip of land extending along the south bank of the Bow River from Louise Bridge to Mewata Park together with the two triangular plots at the inter-sections of Mewata Blvd. & 10th. St. W. and 5th. Ave. respectively. A stretch 200 feet in length was trenched, gravel removed and replaced with soil, planted with trees and shrubs, and a grass verge, 5 feet wide, seeded, wooden curbing laid and a cinder walk verge, 5 feet wide, seeded, wooden curbing laid and a cinder walk provided. Up to December 31st. an additional length of 250 feet has been trenched. The gravel has been taken to the Queen's Park Cemetery site in readiness for road construction, and the boulders to St. George's Island Park for riprapping the banks on either side of the driveway. The area has increased in width as the work progressed westwards from approximately 10 feet to 30 feet. The quantity of earth and gravel moved was 1,800 cu. ft., 348 cu. yds. of gravel removed, 80 cu. yds. loam and 90 cu. yds. manure used. Fifty-nine trees and 245 shrubs planted. <u>GLENCOE TRIANGLE</u>: The City property at the junction of Glencoe Road and 7th, Street, adjoining that of Mrs. Church and about which there has been considerable dispute, due to the fact that Mrs. Church was under the impression that it was her private property, has now become the response statity of this Department. The hedges by which this property is onclosed and which were very much overgrown have been severely trinmed. I beg to recommend that these hedges be removed.

Relief labour 40 hours.

GLENCOE GARDENS: The work of trenching and grading this area, so far as it is owned by the City, was completed, 70 cu. yds. of loam and 52 cu. yds. of manure being used on the plot. Three hundred and four cu. yds. of sub-soil was removed. The total area trenched and graded during the year was 1,089 sq. yds., which area was seeded to grass, and a rustic fence constructed along the north side. A water connection was installed. Exoenditure Labour \$ 274.67 Relief labour 2,574 hours.

WILLIAM'S ISLAND: The ice jam in the Bow River that occured in December raised the suspension bridge that gives access to this island and will require careful examination in the spring, as it may have been damaged.

SUNNYSIDE SUNKEN GARDEN: The development of this area was completed and now consists of a sunken lawn, with the slopes converted into rockeries and planted with suitable material, the whole enclosed with a rustic fence.

Relief labour 112 hours.

HIDDEN TRIANGLE: This area was trenched, 80 cu. yds. manure incorporated, 730 sq. ft. seeded to grass and the whole area enclosed with a rustic fence. Expenditure Labour \$ 181.05 Relief labour 2,174 hours.

SHOULDICE PARK: The negotiations regarding exchange of a certain portion of this park for a piece of the adjoining property were completed. A plan is attached indicating the areas involved in this exchange. In the early part of the year Mr. F. Shouldice wrote requesting that the park be ploughed up and reseeded, the fence re-constructed and an irrigation system installed with a view to development of the land as a park. This request was referred to the City Commissioners and, on their instructions the City Engineer was requested to report on the feasibility of an irrigation system. He reported that, due to the respective levels of the park and river, this was impractical. As no worthwhile development of the park could be carried on without water the request could not be granted.


<u>ARMOURIES PLOT</u>: It is proposed to remodel this plot by removing the shrubbery on the east and south sides, widening the borders on the north and west side to provide space for flowering plants and to thus make this area much more attractive.


KENSINGTON ROAD PLOT: General maintenance. Expenditure Labour \$ 3.40

MISSION PARK: At the request of the residents in the district a path was cleared through the natural woodland and surfaced with gravel. The rustic bridges were repaired. Expenditure Labour \$ 43.80 Relief labour 232 hours. Material 1.14 PREMIER WAY PLOT: The trenching of this plot was completed. A water service was installed and a rustic fence enclosing the plot was constructed. Expenditure Labour \$ 168.90 Relief labour 1,712 hours. Material 53.47 SUPERIOR GARDEN: This new plot was trenched $2\frac{1}{2}$ feet deep over an area of 8,400 sq. feet, eighty-two cu. yds. of clay removed and 66 cu. yds. manure incorporated. This work was completed during the winter of 1937-8. In the spring a shrubbery border was planted and the remaining area seeded to lawn. Expenditure Labour \$ 34.83 Material 34.21 . Relief labour 464 hours Relief labour 464 hours. OGDEN PARK: Three hundred and ninety trees and 1,195 shrubs were pruned and a number of dead ones removed. Relief labour 949 hours. Expenditure Labour \$ 14.85 VALLEYFIELD PARK: Twenty-four trees and 23 shrubs were pruned. Expenditure Labour \$ 1.35 MOUNT ROYAL SCHOOL GROUNDS: Eight trees and 5 shrubs were planted on the school grounds. Expenditure Material\$3.90 · Relief labour 48 hours. VACANT LOTS: Several vacant lots were cleared up at the request of citizens. Relief labour 192 hours. COSTE RESIDENCE: The trees and shrubs on this property are slowly dying because of shortage of water. The water system on the place is completely out of order and the only means we have to irrigate this property is by using a fire hose attached to the hydrant on the street. Due to the same cause the grass on the lawns has been completely killed out and replaced by weeds. An effort was made to keep the place tidy by periodically cutting weeds, trimming hedges, digging borders and removing dead trees and shrubs. Expenditure Labour \$ 77.05 Relief labour 384 hours. HOSPITALS: Relief labour was provided throughout the season to keep, the grounds at the General and Isolation Hospitals in order and some assistance was given at the Mount View Home. Expenditure Labour \$ 20.80 Relief labour 4,035 hours. JUNIOR RED CROSS HOSPITAL: The grass was cut periodically and

HOLY CROSS HOSPITAL: A number of trees were removed from the grounds of this hospital. Expenditure Labour \$ 18.72 Relief labour 240 hours.





PLAYGROUNDS:

No activity of the Department meets with greater public favour than that of our childrens' playgrounds and this is as it should be for organized recreation reduces juvenile delinquency and the amount required to keep one boy in a reformatory will provide play supervision for hundreds of children. Then it should be remembered too that adult criminals often begin their career as juvenile delinquents.

Physical improvements to our playground sites have been quite extensive as the following details indicate.

MAINTENANCE & IMPROVEMENTS

Parkhill Playground: New apparatus consisting of 1 set of swings and a teeter was erected on this playground. I do not consider this a very suitable site for a

playground. It is a very open exposed situation and too far removed from the more thickly settled part of the sub-division. There are more desirable sites available closer in and I beg to recommend that the site be changed.

Roxboro Playground:

New apparatus consisting of 1 gymnasium set, 1 set of swings and a teeter was installed.

Mission Playground

This site, situated at the corner of 25th. Ave. and 1st. St. West is much too small, and, due to passing traffic is extremely dangerous. Furthermore, the use of this area as a playground has proved very disturbing to residents on adjoining properties. It has been decided, therefore, to change the location, and the west portion of a large area of vacant land on the north side of the same block already reserved as a recreation ground has been levelled with a view to fencing and equipping with apparatus during the coming season coming season.

Elbow Park Playground:

As the result of a petition from residents in the district it has been decided to reserve 6 lots at the south end of block 12 at the intersection of 4th. St. & 40th. Ave. S.W. for play-ground purposes. This site is being cleared during the winter and will be equipped next spring.

<u>Central High School Playground:</u> The School Board has consented to this Department taking control of the north-east portion of the school grounds and develop-ing it as a playground. The following equipment has been installed:-l set swings, 1 gymnasium set, 2 teeters and 1 sand box. Relief labour was used to clear and level the site.

Victoria Playground: This is another area where an extremely dangerous condition existed due to passing traffic. A chain link fence was erected on three sides for safety and a close board fence on the fourth to prevent, as far as possible, annoyance to residents on adjoining properties about which there has been considerable complaint for some years past.

Victoria Rotary Playground:

One hundred trees and 28 socues were planted along the river bank.

Playground 5th. Ave. & 1st. St. East: The work of grading this site was completed, the area fenced and a full set of equipment consisting of :- 1 travelling ring set, 1 set of swings, 1 large slide, 1 small slide, 1 teeter, and 1 sand box. This equipment and fencing was provided by the Rotary Club. This playground, notwithstanding its small area has, without doubt been the most popular and intensively used of any in the City. It has been facetiously called the "League of Nations" Playground, a name that could well be adopted, for on it are to be seen children of every nationality resident in the City.

Mewata Park Playground:

It is proposed to move this playground away from the river bank to a more suitable and better protected area farther south.

Sunnyside Playground:

Because of annoyance to residents and damage to property it was found necessary to move the apparatus from the east to the west side. This however, has intensified the dangerous condition that already existed, and I very strongly recommend that this playground be fenced this year. Ten trees were planted.

Sunnyside Bungalow School Playground:

Here again the School Board turned over a portion of the school grounds to the control of this Department and equipment consisting of :- 1 set swings, 1 teeter and 1 sand box was installed.

Tuxedo Park Playground:

A set of swings has been purchased for this playground and will be erected shortly. These will replace the wooden ones which are practically worn out.

Mount Pleasant Rotary Playground:

The picket fencing which encloses the play areas and which I always considered unsuitable for the purpose is rapidly being destroyed and I beg to recommend that it be replaced with chain link fencing.

City Hall Playground:

A commencement was made to develop a playground on vacant land in the vicinity of the City Hall but was abandoned as the site was required for parking purposes.

East Calgary Playground: This was the largest and finest piece of development work accomplished by the Department in 1938 in so far as playground sites are concerned. The lane running east and west and dividing the plot in two was closed, and another lane running north and south was opened across the west end of the property. The whole area required for lawns and ornamental planting was deeply trenched, heavily manured and levelled. The site for play

apparatus was also lovellod, partly fonced and the following equipment provided by the Rotary Club was installed:- 1 set swings, 1 large slide, 1 baby slide, 2 gymnasiums, 1 teeter, 1 giant stride, and 1 horizontal ladder. Signs should be placed on 9th. Ave. warning drivers of vohicles of the vicinity of this playground.

Weeds and grass were out on the following playgrounds:-Bankview, Eau Claire, Victoria, Central Rotary, Central High School, Sunnyside, Sunnyside School.

It will be noted that the recorded attendance at the playgrounds was almost double that of 1937. This is accounted for by the fact that, first, no record of attendance at Riley Park was kept in 1937, secondly, the attendance at Victoria Rotary Playground increased enormously, and thirdly, there were two new centres in 1938.

A course of training was kindly provided for the supervisors by the Y.M.C.A. for some weeks prior to the opening of the grounds.

Due to the fact that inter-playground competitions in baseball and other sports has in past years created too keen a spirit of rivalry, encouraged in some instances by the supervisors, leading to a desire to win at any price and militating against one of the principle objects of playground work, namely to train the children in good sportmanship, these competitive games between playgrounds were entirely eliminated except for such friendly games as the supervisors felt disposed to arrange.

Until it is found possible to provide year-round supervision, it has been suggested that the playground season open on June 1st. and close on September 30th, the play being supervised during the two extra months from 4 to 5 p.m. and from 6.30 to dusk.

Paddle tennis was introduced into the playgrounds for the first time this year and proved immensely popular.

Much useful instruction in First Aid work was done on most of the playgrounds.

The pageant held in connection with the Field Day proved very popular and made a very pleasing feature in the programe. Each playground adopted certain colours, and material was provided to enable the youngsters to wear these colours. After a grand parade each playground performed its particular contribution to the programe.

Victoria Rotary Playground was by far the most popular and best attended centre. The Medel Dairies very kindly denated the services of two trucks and two gallons of ice eream for the purpose of a picnic held at Burnside. This event was greatly enjoyed by the children. The supervisor at this playground was most enthusiastic and enterprising and I attribute the success attained largely due to this fact.

Riloy Park, as usual, proved a very popular contro due to the many attractions this park has for children and also largely due to the enthusiasm of the supervisor. An excellent system of checking equipment in and out was inaugurated with the result that there were no losses. Some excellent handicraft work was produced by this playground.

Killarney could be made a very popular playground were more facilities provided. I hope this will be possible in the course of the next year or two.


Supervision of the Sunnyside Bungalow School Playground was provided at the request of the Home & School Association of the district, but was very much of a failure due to the fact that it is in too close proximity to Riley Park, where the facilities and attractions are so much greater, and the children prefer to go to that park. According to the report of the supervisor there was also lack of co-operation, almost amounting to opposition, from the janitor of the school at times, which did not help to popularize this playground.


'Mewata Park proved a popular centre, there being an average attendance of 90 per day, the same group attending throughout the season. Some very fine basket work was done on the ground due to the interest taken in this work by Mrs. Sadler, wife of the supervisor who was in almost as regular attendance at the playground as her husband.

During the first month of supervision the attendance at Riverside Playground was extremely poor but improved tremendously during the latter part of the season. This rather important playground suffered under a severe handicap due to the fact that, in the first instance a supervisor new to the playground and, in fact new to the work, was placed in charge, and just when this particular supervisor was getting settled down to the work she left to take another position. Fortunately it was possible to secure the services of the person who had been in charge of this playground for the past several years and who quickly improved conditions.

Criticism was voiced because no supervision has been provided at the new playground opened in August at the intersection of 5th. Ave. & 1st. St. East. I would point out that we now have 25 of these equipped playgrounds and provision was made in last year's appropriation for the supervision of 10. The allotment for supervision will have to be considerably increased if all these playgrounds are to be supervised.

RINKS:

RENOVATIONS & IMPROVEMENTS

Parkhill Athletic Grounds Rink: Some further grading was done by which the location of the rink was changed somewhat. An addition was made to the shelter to house a public address system, purchased and installed by the lads of the community.

Bankview Athletic Rink: Two buildings were placed on the grounds by the Public Works Dept. to be used as shelters. The lumber that formed the hockey rink at the Royal Sunalta Recreation Grounds was removed and re-erected here to form an additional enclosed rink. <u>Royal Sunalta Rink</u>: This area was abandoned as a rink site. <u>Earl Grey Rink</u>: A considerable amount of work was done on this rink site. The bank at the south end of the property was graded back to provide enough material to bring the lower rink site to the level of the upper one, 1,664 cu. yds. of earth being moved. At the expense of the local community club the building was moved from the lower level to a position at the top of the bank close to the road, stuccoed and sewer and water installed. The wooden rink sides were re-built.

Killarney Park Rink: The building was renovated.

Bridgeland Playground Rink: The building was moved back to the lane. Bridgeland Athletic Grounds Rink: The public address system installed here and operated by the local community organization has proved a great annoyance to patients in the General Hospital and complaints have been frequent. It is suggested that the rink be moved to the extreme east end of the grounds. This would entail considerable expense, and would do little towards abating the nuisance. I am of the opinion that music should be prohibited on this rink or the rink abandoned. Another complaint voiced by the hospital authorities is that a great number of people using this rink pass directly through the hospital grounds to gain access to it. This, also, is considered a source of annoyance. <u>Regal Terrace Rink</u>: Further levelling was done on this rink site. <u>Balmoral Rink</u>: Because of complaints from local residents this rink was moved to the south-east corner of the block. <u>Hillhurst Park Rink</u>: This has become an immensely popular centre due undoubtedly to the music provided. There are frequently as many as 600 people skating here at one time. <u>Westmount Boulevard Rink</u>: The enclosure has been removed, but three open rinks have been maintained, resulting in the accomodation of a great many more skaters, particularly children, than formerly.



SHAGANAPPI PARK MUNICIPAL GOLF COURSE: There was a good deal more precipitation during the golf season than in several previous years, particularly during weekends, which resulted in considerable loss of revenue. The condition of the course during the strike was also the cause of considerable loss. But the chief cause of reduced revenue was due to a reduction in beer sales, the regulations regarding the same of beer being more rigidly enforced than heretofore.

The City Open Tournament was held on June 26th. One hundred and ten players participating. An experiment was tried of extending the privileges of the Course to students at the reduced rate of 15¢ per round during the holiday season. Two hundred and seven 15¢ fees were taken. Eighty-three guest tickets were issued for practice rounds for those participating in the Tournament. In the estimates for 1939 as prepared by myself and submitted

In the estimates for 1939 as prepared by myself and submitted to the City Commissioners a considerable increase is shown, caused mainly by items for improvements to the Golf House, new equipment, and extension of water system. As I pointed out in my report of last year I think the patronage and revenue of the Golf Course can only be increased by improving its physical condition.

The Course was open from March 12th. to October 7th. Games played, 16,749 Average daily attendance, 78 Number of days Course used, 210 Largest attendance in one day, (May 15th.) 409

<u>Improvements made in 1938</u>: Two new wooden frames for ladies' tees, two new rubber mats for ladies' tees. Men's No. 5 fairway seeded with crested wheat grass, a large quantity of rocks removed from fairways and replaced with loam. Fourteen barrels of heavy oil, lo barrels of crank case oil and 80 cu. yds. sand used on greens. The approaches to a number of greens were stripped and returfed, seven hundred and twenty sq. yds. turf being used. The material removed (120 cu. yds.) was used to fill in bunker on No. 1 fairway. Eighty cu. yds. gravel screened and spread on main driveway. Dining room and caretaker's quarters in Golf House were painted, showers lined with water-proof material and painted. MEWATA PARK: The bleachers at the base ground, which have been in an extremely dangerous condition for some time past, were wrecked in part and such lumber as could be salvaged used to renovate those that remained, - 6 in number. These bleachers were erected in 1913. This work cost in labour and material 74.42 and 168 hours of relief labour.

MEWATA STADIUM: The refreshment booth at the south end of the grandstand was enlarged and completely remodeled at a cost of 113.41 for labour and material. Pickets were placed on the fence enclosing the track along the extent of this enclosure. Permits were issued for 33 soccer games, 20 soft-ball games, 6 rugby games, 2 for school sports, 2 for school meets, 1 for Caledonia games, 2 for fall sports meets and 9 for high school rugby games. Tuesday and Thursday nights were reserved for training juniors for track and field events, when about 30 boys and girls attended. BRIDGELAND ATHLETIC GROUNDS: Some progress was made during the past year with the grading of this area and the local community organi-zation operated the rink during the winter. The development of this area has been exceedingly slow and most disappointing in view of the enormous amount of relief labour, some 14,078 hours that has been expended on it during the past four years, this labour have been used there as a result of the incessant demands of the local organizations.

CHINOOK BOWLING GREENS: The vacant land in the vicinity of these bowling greens was kept mown to prevent seeding of weeds. Expenditure Labour \$ 8.40 Relief labour 250 hours.

BOW VALLEY BOWLING GREENS: These grees were supplied with a quantity of loam for top-dressing purposes. Expenditure Labour \$ 6.20

GIRL GUIDES' CLUB GROUNDS: These grounds were cleared up and mowed and the hedge cultivated and trimmed. Expenditure Labour \$ 5.40 Relief labour 84 hours.

PARKHILL RECREATION GROUNDS: General maintenance. Expenditure Labour \$ 12.85 Relief labour 424 hours.

BOULEVARDS: Grass was cut twice during the season. Hedges interfering with vision or encroaching on sidewalks were trimmed. The soil removed was utilized on the Mewata Boulevard. Two hundred and fifty feet of boulevard was trenched on 8th. Avenue East in front of the Chinook Bowling Club, to be seeded next spring. The boulevard strip bordering the Dominion Bridge property on the west side (Macleod Trail), trenched during 1937, was planted in part with 67 trees and 173 shrubs. This completes about two thirds of the boulevard. SUMMARY:

Visitors often comment on the charm the street trees give to this City, more particularly when seen from the surrounding heights, and past residents who return and who can remember Calgary as a treeless City, are particularly enthusiastic. The wholesale removal of these trees and the mutilation of those that remain that is now taking place is greatly to be deplored, and will undoubtedly be very much criticized as a short-sighted policy at some future time when Calgary again becomes practically treeless, as might easily be the case if the present rate of destruction continues. There are cases, of course, where it is necessary and even desirable that certain trees should be removed, but the most paltry reasons are now being advanced by certain citizens as excuses to induce the City to remove boulevard trees. It is unfortunate that, due to altitude and climatic conditions, we are very restricted as regards the species of trees that can be grown here, -- green ash, birch, American elm and the several species of poplar, together with a few conifer. It has to be admitted that the poplar is not the most desirable tree in locations more favoured climatically than Calgary. Compared with the poplars, however, the three first-mentioned species are extremely slow-growing, and, for that reason, will take longer, but will, eventually, have just the same effect on sewers, overhead wires, concrete sidewalks and lawns as the latter. Twenty-five years ago the majority of requests that reached the Parks Department office during the spring season was for street trees to be planted office during the spring season was for street trees to be planted, and it was invariably poplars that were asked for because of their rapid growth. Now the most common request is to have these same trees removed, and often these requests come from people who have trees actually on their own property that are probably quite as injurious or more so than those on the street. For some extraordinary reason many citizens look on that portion of the boulevard and the trees on it as pretty much their own property to be treated solely according to their own ideas, though they do not take that attitude with regard to sidewalk, paving, etc., apparently failing to realize that all parts of the public street are the property of all citizens, and, further, that it is very desirable that there should be a uniformity of treatment of the boulevard on each individual street. <u>CEMETERIES</u>, <u>GENERAL</u>: There was a decrease in the number of relief labour hours in the Cemeteries as compared with 1937 of 25,597. The amount of work involved in maintenance increases every year as each cemetery becomes filled up and monuments are erected at the graves and shrubs planted. The grass around these shrubs and monu-ments must be kept trimmed, the plots cultivated and graves maintained. Borders and driveways must also be maintained. At the present time in the several cemeteries there are 8,497 monuments, 931 trees & shrubs on private plots, 281 shrubbery groups on the sections containing 5,387 trees and shrubs. There are 6,946 trees and 8,539 shrubs in borders, 50 acres of grass areas to be mowed and

watered, ten and a half acres of borders to be cultivated and $3\frac{1}{2}$ miles of driveway, 20 ft. wide, to be maintained. There are some 39,100 feet of water line, including feed lines and sprinkler system in the various Cemeteries to be kept in condition and extended as required. Annually some 400 sunken graves have to be levelled and re-sodded. These figures are being annually increased by the addition of some 800 burials which entail a corresponding increase in grass area, flower beds, driveways, water service etc. to be maintained.

UNION CEMETERY: Five hundred and forty-one lineal feet of cobble-stone guttering was constructed. A large area of the cemetery was heavily topdressed with fertilizer, 170 cu. yds. being used. All necessary removals and replacements were made on shrubbery borders. A pleasing type of sign to designate sections constructed in rustic work were used to replace the old style. Special Memorial Services were held as follows:

June 12, - Unveiling monument to late Capt. Sir Cecil E. Denny, R.N.W.M.P. July 10, - B.P.O.E. Memorial Day. Aug. 21, - Oddfellows Memorial Day. "21, - Citizens Memorial Day.

Arrangements were made and assistance given as required for

all these services. All soldiers' graves were marked with flags and men were on duty to raise and lower flags, direct traffic and keep order during these services.

NURSERIES: Work was delayed owing to the late spring. There was a heavy snowfall early in April which held up the work for some time. Tree and shrub lifting was about two weeks later than usual.

Owing to a strike of relief workers there was a decided shortage of help at the time when it was most needed. For the months of April and May 1938 there was only 448 hours used in nurseries as compared with the 970 hours in the preceeding year. It was well advanced into summer before the necessary number of men were available.

11,285 tree and shrub cuttings were made and planted.

2,215 trees and shrubs transplanted. 823 Perennial plants were propagated by division. 39 kinds and varieties of tree and shrub seeds were sown. The following nursery stock was used for permanent planting in the various parks and cemeteries; 4,680 trees and shrubs,

25,951 perennials, 53 vines. Approximately one third of the nursery was manured and a large amount of digging was done in the fall. The weather was very favourable for this work as it remained mild until late in the season.

A fence consisting of iron posts with wire netting 8 feet high was erected on the north side of the nursery service yard and planted to vines to hide it from view from the main drive. Seed Exchange:

Quantities of seed collected by the Department were exchanged with other collectors and Parks Departments in England, New Zealand, United States and Canada. More than 500 packets of seed were received.

Trees, shrubs and plants were received by the same medium of exchange.

Newly tried out species:

11 Pyrus crosses from the Central Experimental Farm, Ottawa. These all made good growth and withstood the winter of 1937 with the exception of one plant which died immediately on planting. 10 Syringa Prestoniae crosses from the same source made ex-

cellent growth and flowered well. These also stood the winter without killing back. There are some splendid forms of lilac in these, some of the blooms being exceptionally large. All seemed to be distinct in form or colour.

7 New crosses of apples were received from the Province of Alberta Horticultural Station at Brooks. These all made successful growth the first season, but have not been exposed to a winter yet.

The following Berberis and Cotone ter species, as seed, were received from the Arnold Arboretum, Boston, Mass., two years ago. Berberis Koreana made healthy growth; seems to be hardy, after

one year in nursery.

Berberis vernae. This shrub grew sturdily and shows every sign of being perfectly hardy.

Cotoneaster acutifolia villilosa, one year in nursery, 25% of plants survived the winter.

Spiraea pikoviensis, 1 year in nursery, 100% hardy. Philadelphus Lewisii. This shrub has been in the nursery for 3 years and appears to be perfectly hardy. This summer (1938) it bloomed very profusely. It is a beautiful flowering shrub and a splendid acquisition to the Department's collection of shrubs.

A number of experiments in horticultural practice were conducted, the principle of these being the sterilizing of soil for seed-sowing, which, when the correct method was followed, was found to increase and speed up germination to a marked degree, and the use of sulphate of iron as a cure for chlorosis, which disease has been very prevalent amongst all classes of plants for several years past. This proved effective when a solution of the right strength was applied. When too weak it was ineffective, and when too strong it was injurious, the effective strength varying with different species. This necessitated considerable experimenting. An experiment has been carried on over a period of two years on a certain plot of land badly infested with dandelions to determine the effect of a preparation of sulphate of iron and sulphate of ammonia on these weeds. The dandelions were certainly fewer in number and less vigorous at the end of last season. It is proposed to continue the treatment. Black spot has become very prevalent in the city during the last year or two. Rose bushes were sprayed with copper sulphate and lime applied to the roots as remedial measures. The effect of this treatment will not be apperent till next season. Value of stock in nurseries at present time, \$ 15,148.66

POLICING: In the early part of the year all skating and hockey rinks were patrolled, the object being to prevent the use of hockey sticks on skating rinks and to keep order. During the summer months all parks, playgrounds, cemeteries

and river banks were patrolled as frequently as was possible for one man to cover the ground. Some trouble was experienced at Crescent and Riley Parks and on Memorial Drive with persons playing golf. The Stadium refreshment stand was broken into and some merchandise was stolen. This was reported to the Detective Department, but it was not possible to secure a conviction.

Many complaints were received from residents on 16th. Ave. West with regard to vandalism at Central Rotary Playground. All residents in the neighbourhood were notified that if the trouble continued, in all probability the playground would be removed to a new site and all persons found on the playground after 10 p.m. would be prose-

cuted. This had the desired effect. Eight relief workers were used to patrol the river banks. No swimming fatalities occured during the season.

Some trouble was experienced with certain residents in Mount Royal who persisted in depositing refuse on the boulevards. All residents were warned and, after one or the prosecutions, there was no further trouble.

The patrolman spent some considerable time at the Golf Course

for the purpose, if necessary, of ejecting any persons, not members, who demanded the facilities of the golf house. During the strike of relief Lorkers the patrolman assisted the regular police force that was on duty at that time. All important football and baseball games were attended, also the

Memorial services, for the purpose of regulating traffic and keeping order.

Complaints were received from some of the playgrounds regarding the larger children monopolizing the space for playing rugby, etc., thereby interfering with the play of the smaller children. The patrolman was furnished with a car for his own use in October. This has facilitated his work to a very great extent. The following is a record of prosecutions and warnings:

During the summer months the services of the Corps of Commissionaires were used to a very great advantage. The hours of these men are from 6 p.m. to 6 a.m., just that period when the staff of the Department are absent and the greatest damage is done to park property. The improvement in conditions as a result of the use of these men was very marked. They gave us excellent service and I strongly recommend that they be used again.
