ANNUAL REPORT 1939

To His Worship the Mayor, Commissioner, and City Council:

Gentlemen:

I beg to present my 26th Annual Report dealing with the work of this Department.

The year has been an eventful one in some respects, the outstanding occurance as it effected the Department, being the visit of Their Majesties the King and Queen, which is commented on farther on in this Report.

During the past several years much "created" work has been done for the purpose of utilizing relief labour with the result that there has been considerable expansion of the Parks and Playgrounds system of this City. Apparently the public have been well pleased with this development and proud of the fact that Calgary is gradually being provided with adequate recreational facilities and is also becoming known as one of the most beautiful cities in Western Canada becoming known as one of the most beautiful cities in Western Canada. It might be as well to point out, however, that this relief labour is liable to decrease as conditions improve, that all this development means increased maintenance costs, that upon the Parks' executive rests the responsibility for maintaining, servicing, protecting and policing these areas and that this means that the same public who appear to so greatly appreciate these things must be prepared to pay this additional cost of maintenance or be satisfied to see the parks revert to their original wild, untidy and uncared-for condition, in which case, unfortunately, the Parks' Department is usually blamed for this apparent neglect. I do, however, think that if citizens can be induced to take into consideration what they receive in pleasure and service for the extremely small additional per capita tax cost required they will be quite willing that the necessary funds shall be provided.

May I again be permitted to stress the great need for May I again be permitted to stress the great need for young men of some education on the staff of this Department to replace the men retiring from year to year. The Parks systems of the larger cities are not the simple affairs they were in the past. The executive of such a system and, to some extent, the personnel of the staff must possess technical knowledge along many lines, something more than the ability to grow flowers, make lawns and plant trees as so many people seem to think. Of course a knowledge of landscape architecture and the use and care of plant material is essential. Civil engineering, building construction, construction and draining of driveways, disposal of sewerage and garbage, prevention of pollution and purification of bathing waters, police work, traffic control, and a knowledge of the law regarding these things, the fundamentals of play and recreation in all its forms, qualities required in play directors, accountancy, ability to prepare estimates, fundamentals of play and recreation in all its forms, qualities required in play directors, accountancy, ability to prepare estimates, all these things and many others now come within the range of park work and it is very essential not only that the executive head should possess the necessary knowledge, but that the staff should have train-ing fitting them for the various duties required of them. Attached is a graph showing the hours of relief labour allotted to this Department during the period 1932-39. The increase in 1939 over 1938 is due to the fact that the men were required to work their hours off according to the amount of relief they were getting, instead of a flat 40 hours per month as previously. The reports appearing periodically in the Council minutes indicate that more hours of relief labour are regularly allotted to

the Parks' Department than to any other City department. In this connection I would point out that it is generally thought (quite erroneously) that there is considerable "light" work, suitable for men who are not in physical condition for heavy labour, to be had in this Department. Consequently it would appear that most of these "light duty" men are allotted to us and these constitute practically 25% of the whole number coming to us. Of the more able bodied men, many are very incompetent, due to the fact that they have had no experience in the work required of them. During the past summer I was granted leave of absence to enable me to visit Great Britain, after an absence of more than 30 years.

It was not possible to leave till after planting of all kinds, including the summer floral displays, had been completed. This meant that the best season in the Old Country, from a horticultural standpoint, was past. However, many public parks in the larger cities, private gardens of large estates, commercial nurseries, and such establishments as Kew, the Royal Botanic Gardens, Edinburgh, and the Royal Horticultural Society's Trial Gardens at Wisley were visited and much useful information acquired.

I am happy to say that it has been found possible to keep within the appropriation provided for this Department, notwithstanding that there has been several items of expenditure that were not anticipated or provided for, such as the Royal Visit, work done on several new park areas, grading and seeding Red Cross Hospital Grounds, cleaning and pointing the South African Memorial, dismantling comfort station at Mewata Park, and additional expenditure on bleachers at the Stadium.

Due to the heavy precipitation during the spring and early summer season there was a very heavy growth of grass and natural herbage on the undeveloped and natural park areas. This created a considerable fire risk. During the fall and early winter these areas were cut over to eliminate this risk.

<u>New Areas Acquired</u>: Town-planning authorities say that a city should have at least one acre of park to each one hundred of population. Due to the annual addition of areas to the Parks system of this City, Calgary is fast approaching that desirable state. That a good Parks system is good business is shown by the fact that a large manufacturing industry, seeking a new location for expansion, after due consideration, selected Dayton, Ohio, for the purpose, his reason being to use his own words, "I can only say that it is the liveableness of your city that decided the issue."

ness of your city that decided the issue." The following plots have been placed in charge of this Department during the past year:-

Lot 13, Block L, Plan 2112-A.C., 23rd Avenue and 5th Street West, Section 9, Mission. Trenching of this area was commenced and a fence erected on the south and east sides.

Lots 19-20, Block A, Plan 3252 W., Section 9, at the intersection of 30th Avenue and Elbow Drive. This plot was trenched in readiness for planting next spring.

The most easterly part, roughly triangular in shape, of Lot 6, Block 236, Plan 5700 A.G., Section 17, Sunalta.

<u>Weather</u>: January was an extraordinary mild month, the temperature dropping below zero on two nights only. The mean of max. temperatures 30; mean min. 16; mean daily temperature 24.5 degrees. February was much colder, particularly in the early part of the month, the mean being 20 degrees lower namely, 4.8 degrees. The lowest recorded temperature for some years was experienced on February 9 - 42 degrees

below zero, but by the 17th the thermometer rose to 48 degrees above. In fact the whole month was marked by extreme and rather sudden In fact the whole month was marked by extreme and rather sudden fluctuations. There was also considerably more precipitation, in the form of snow, than in January. March was marked by more extreme fluctuations even than February, temperatures ranging all the way from 28 below zero to 70 above. The first few days were very mild, but there was a heavy snowfall on the 3rd. During the first week of April there was a good deal of snow, but during the rest of the month it was dry and mild. May also was comparatively dry with normal temperatures. June was a very wet month, rain falling on no less than 19 days. On 3 days upwards of one inch fell in the 24 hours. Conse-quently there was very little sunshine and temperatures were low for quently there was very little sunshine and temperatures were low for the period of the year. The abundant moisture, was however, very favourable to growth and ideal for planting operations. July was hot and dry, as was August. A slightly higher precipitation was recorded, but no great benefit was derived from this moisture because of excessive heat. September was a very pleasant month with light, but fairly frequent rains and moderately warm temperatures. Similar weather was experienced in October till the 22nd when there was a heavy fall of wet snow which did considerable damage to trees, and the temperature dropped several points below zero during the last few nights. November and December were unseasonably mild and excessively dry.

ROYAL VISIT: The work entailed on this Department as a result of the visit of Their Majesties the King and Queen consisted of decorating the Council Chamber, providing floral displays in the City Hall Garden and at the Cenotaph, and, to some extent, supervising the erection of bleachers where park properties were affected.

The Royal Visit taking place at a season of the year before the normal time for the bedding out of plants, and whilst there was still risk of frost, special arrangements had to be made. Accordingly the material to be used was grown on so as to be at its full stage of development at the time required, the plants were retained in their pots and plunged in the beds as thickly as possible so as to completely furnish the beds and give a mass of blossom. This necessitated the use of an enormous number of plants for the comparatively small area to be beautified, some 5,000 Pansy plants alone being used in two small beds at the City Hall. The purpose of plunging the plants in their pots was for ease of removal in case of a sudden \mathbf{the} drop in temperature, also to avoid disturbing the roots of the plants as much as possible in view of their future use for the regular summer floral display.

All the available spaces in the Council Chamber were banked with masses of flowering plants, ferns and other foliage plants, and a

quantity of cut flowers were used in suitable situations. Large palms, dracaenas, etc., were used in the hallways. The whole effect was very pleasing and seemed to give general satisfaction to the public. The outdoor floral displays that "grew overnight", as their sudden appearance was described, in particular received much favourable comment.

The material used consisted of 1,520 Salvias, 1,590 Geraniums, 6,720 Pansies and 880 Petunias. Some 900 pot plants were used in the City Hall. Criticism was voiced in some quarters regarding the erection of bleachers on planted areas. Whilst trees and shrubs in some instances had to be cut, no permanent damage was done.

ST. GEORGE'S ISLAND PARK:

The popularity of the Island appears to increase annually judging from the vast throngs that visit it during the summer months. Seventy permits for picnics for large organizations were issued. No record is kept of the hundreds of small family picnics that are taking place daily throughout the summer season. During the time of the Royal Visit the many visitors to the City from outside points took advantage of the occasion to visit St. George's Island, a very conservative estimate placing the number at 10,000. Notwithstanding the fact that this vast assemblage of people resulted in a correspondingly huge gathering of autos, there was a remarkable freedom from accidents of all kinds, the only ones reported to this Department being the grazing of a car fender and a lost child. The parking of the enormous number of cars however, was an extremely difficult task. One of the most noticeable features on this occasion was the extreme orderliness of the people.

The floral displays were very successful and elicited a great deal of favourable comment.

A small clump of shrubs was planted west of the Calgary Fort Model. Sixty spruce trees were planted to form a setting for the fossil house. It is proposed to extend this planting. Fifty spruce trees were planted on the north side of the north road to hide the fence and form a wind break. Spruce trees were also planted around the comfort stations and the log cabin. Vines were planted at the base of the walls of the Fort Model and the fossil house. Nine large trees donated by the Calgary Brewing & Malting Company were planted as specimen trees on the lawns.

The whole of the lawn areas were rolled with a spiked roller which seemed to prove very beneficial, so much so that they have a better appearance than ever before. A crazy stone path was laid across the lawn from the parking ground to the Zoo to take the place of the muddy trail that has been created by constant wear. The bank on the north side of the south road was riprapped with

The bank on the north side of the south road was riprapped with rough stone and planted with rock plants. Small rockeries were constructed at the base of the main gate posts. Planks and railing were laid on the old bridge structure to form

Planks and railing were laid on the old bridge structure to form a footbridge for the purpose of giving access to St. Patrick's Island.

It was not found possible to make the suggested changes to the residence, which is in urgent need of repair. The only work done on the building was to provide a bathroom and install a bath and provide new storm sash.

A large summer house was erected at the extreme east end of the Island to serve as a shelter for the playground and to accommodate picnic parties. More of these shelters could be erected with advantage throughout the Island to provide very necessary shelter for picnic parties. It is proposed to remove picnic tables at the west end of the lawn further west and to provide a kitchen for picnics. The comfort stations are badly in need of renovation and modernizing. The old bandstand is in a very dilapidated condition and should be either renovated or removed.

The wading pool shelter was re-floored and painted. A new concession building was erected by the Zoological Society. Four additional picnic tables were constructed large enough to accommodate 30 people each. Three hundred feet of new rustic fencing was erected along the side of the south road.

The oiling of the driveway on the Island proved very beneficial by keeping trees and shrubs free of dust and added much to the comfort of visitors to the Island. These driveways, having become very rough, were scarified in the late fall. The site of the old pavilion was levelled and gravelled, thereby adding considerably to the car-parking space.

the car-parking space. During the season a public address system was installed without cost to the Department, which seemed to be much appreciated by the public. The baseball diamond proved very popular and spectators, sometimes reaching 1,000 in number congregated to watch the games. The 4th Calgary (Elk's Own) Boy Scout Troop again conducted a First Aid Station at the Island and report as follows:

Dinosaur Garden: Another model was erected to the west of the ball diamond by the Zoological Society and 2 others completed. All the fossil specimens were shellaced.

Police court action was taken against offenders on 22 occasions, including 5 cases of drunkenness, 3 of assault, 3 of damage to property, 3 cases of car thefts and 2 cases of thefts from the Zoo. On 3 occasions the concession building was burglarized and 3 convictions were obtained for the breaking of electric lights. It is unfortunate from the point of view of prevention of crime and vandalism that no publicity is given in the press when cases are brought before the Juvenile Court. In those cases where it has been possible to give publicity, the local press has co-operated with this Department very readily, and it has been found that this publicity has a restraining effect. I take this opportunity to point out that much of the vandalism that occurs, particularly that perpetrated by young lads is not so much of a criminal nature as an expression of

pure animal spirit and bravado. This emphasizes the need that has so often previously stressed of abundant recreational facilities for these youths, that their leisure time may be fully occupied in healthy sports. Expenditure Labour

ST. GEORGE'S ISLAND ZOO: The Zoological Society is proposing to replace the unsightly fence on the south side of the deer pens with a chain link fence. In erecting this fence the intention is to

straighten the line and to extend this fence 10 feet westwards. The old concession building was moved to the east end and converted into a shelter for pea fowl. The original pea fowl house was re-roofed, insulated and an additional window put in. The lion dens were insulated, but these require complete re-construction.

A building was erected to be used as a winter shelter for the seal and leopards. A well was dug in the basement of the building and a motor pump installed. A suitable guard fence is in course of erection in front of all pens housing dangerous animals. Minor alterations and repairs were made to the monkey house. Two pheasant houses were re-modelled to form one building to

serve the purpose of a dove cote. Feeding racks were constructed in the several deer pens. Two hundred feet of wire netting fence was erected to the east of the beaver pens to form a pen for antelope. All the natural growth in the deer pens has been destroyed. It is proposed to plant groups of trees in these enclosures and fence these to protect them from the animals. The pathway in front of the main range of cages was ploughed and surfaced with 66 yards of gravel and sand sand.

Other improvements consisted of the following:- Re-cementing of pool around the fountain, re-cementing of beaver pond, and cougar pen. The construction of 19 feeding troughs for birds and waterfowl, 24 rodent huts, one seal pond, leopard pen, 4 feeding racks for deer, 14 self-feeders for pheasants. Repairs to hay-shed and partitions in duck and monkey house. Two gates for deer pens, steel gate in large carnivorous pens, double fence in front of grizzly bear and monkey pens. A double fence around squirrels, seal, leopards etc.

The cost of all alterations and additions to the Zoo buildings and enclosures has been provided by the Zoological Society, relief labour only being furnished by the Parks' Department. Expenditure Labour \$ 1,717.44

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<u>RILEY PARK</u>: Considerable progress was made with the alteration at the east entrance. The location of the driveway within the park was changed and the landscaping in the immediate vicinity completely remodelled, with a view to setting the entrance back some 50 feet from 10th Street N.W. This will make this entrance much safer for traffic and improve the appearance of this end of the park to a considerable extent. Five hundred feet of new curbing was laid. The Peony bed, which is one of the interesting features of this park, was trenched and replanted. The flag pole was re-painted. Two of the cricket pitches were returfed. The concrete lining of the pool was repaired. The entire lawn surface has been heavily dressed with manure during the winter.

PLAYGROUNDS:

The appointment of a permanent full time playground superintendent has now been definitely decided upon. There is no doubt whatever that, if the proper person is engaged, the value of our playground work will be enhanced immensely thereby. I feel certain, however, that success can only be obtained if that individual has had proper training for the work perticularly in give of the fact that this is training for the work, particularly in view of the fact that this is an entirely new venture in so far as this City is concerned and that the appointee will have to build up an almost completely new organi-zation. He should not have to learn his job at the expense of the City, but should already be equipped with all the necessary qualifications, and that is the opinion most emphatically expressed by those who are responsible for this work in other cities. That full information might be secured on the subject, I was instructed by the Parks and Playgrounds Committee to send out a comprehensive questionnaire to a number of other cities, and I give below answers to the question, "What should be the qualifications of such a person?" received from some of these cities: Hamilton says, "It cannot be denied that one requires training before undertaking a job and denied that one requires training before undertaking a job, and playground supervision is no exception. Neither can it be denied that the trained person is better fitted, other things being equal, for the job he undertakes to do. Our experience over many years has

shown that the greatest number of failures on our staff has been from those without training. The necessity and importance of a trained staff is recognized by every executive and it is becoming more and more a rule that none but qualified, trained leaders be engaged for playground supervision administration. A playground superintendent in charge of recreational activities of a city should have a good educational background and should have had previous experience in an executive position of equal or lower rank in a experience in an executive position of equal or lower rank in a recreation system. By previous experience is meant--supervision of a playground or community centre, camp director, etc. Experience as a business executive, physical director, personnel manager or school executive is especially valuable, but should not be accepted in lieu of experience or special training more directly connected with the administration of recreation. The term 'head supervisor' doesn't fully express the statesmentike meaning of the meant of the fully express the statesmanlike requirements of the position, or the functions which such an executive must exercise. Finally, the nature and duties of the recreation executive, pertaining to the organization and administration of the recreation system are such as to make it necessary to have had experience and training in the work. In short, the success or failure of the step you propose to take depends upon one thing and one thing only, namely, that he be properly qualified to handle the work." Toronto replies, "He should have executive ability; sympathy and understanding in dealing with children, parents and fellow-workers; a breadth of vision which will enable him to keep in touch with changing conditions and requirements; he should be thoroughly trained in playground activities, including all classes of major and minor sports; be fully qualified to train others in leadership and good citizenship; and have a real enthusiasm in all the various phases of playground work." Vancouver replies, "The principal qualifications should be a should be a should be a principal qualifications should be a physical education diploma, training in first-aid work and executive ability." Spokane considers that such an individual should be a college graduate, should have taken a considerable amount of physical education and recreation and athletics. He should have a good understanding of psychology. He should have a good background in sociology. He should have a good physique and a good personality. Ann Arbor, Michigan, considers that he should have special training in the field of physical education, recreation and health education. recreation and health education, with some experience as a teacher, playground director and community centre worker, camp director or director of any special Boy Scout or Y.M.C.A. activity. The cities whose expressions of opinion I have quoted have made a marked success of their recreational work.

I was absent from the City during the period of playground supervision and so am unable to speak from personal observation as to the success or otherwise of the season's work. It was most unfortunate that there were several changes of staff after the season opened which must have had a very disorganizing effect on the work. Every effort will be made next season to see that those engaged will remain with

us throughout the two months' period. Due to the extremely warm weather that prevailed during the greater part of the playground season, the quieter forms of recreation, such as handicraft work were more popular than usual. However, paddle tennis, introduced last year, proved exceedingly popular in all the playgrounds.

Most of the playgrounds organized hikes and picnics, in some cases or more playgrounds combining for the purpose. The Y.M.C.A. and the Y.W.C.A. again permitted us the use of their

respective swimming pools. This was greatly appreciated by all concerned.

The facilities at this particular playground are not of the best for supervised play, due to the fact that the area is almost completely taken up with apparatus, thus making it impossible to carry on any team games and further, there is no shelter of any kind on this ground. A supervisor was placed here at the very urgent request of the Home and School Association of the District, but, in view of the inadequancy of the facilities, I was somewhat dubious regarding the success of this centre as a supervised playground. However, according to the supervisor that was placed there, the season was a fairly successful one, but both she and the supervisor at St. George's Island are most emphatic that the two playgrounds are much too close together, and that there is much confusion due to the fact that the children pass from one to the other, according to the activities that may be in progress, which goes to show that one playground at St. George's Island can very well serve the whole district. It will be noted that there is a general increase in the number of players, this being attributed to the better condition of the course during the past season. Patrons of the course seem to have been more satisfied with conditions and very few complaints have been registered.

There has been considerable agitation with regard to a water system for the course and a survey has been made and estimates prepared for two alternative schemes. It is assumed that the matter will have due consideration this year. The City Tournament was held on June 11th, with 130 players

participating.

Improvements made in 1939: A steel bridge was erected across the gully on the 14th fairway, under the direction of the Engineer's Department at a cost of $\frac{1}{9}$ 2,474.19. This is something that patrons have agitated for for a number of years, and will undoubtedly prove of great benefit. It is most important that this bridge be painted as soon as possible.

A new floor was laid in the kitchen of the Club House and this was covered with linoleum. Twenty-four new chairs were added to the Was covered with linoleum. Twenty-four new chairs were added to the Club room equipment and the old ones were repainted. Gas was installed in the locker rooms, and the ceiling of the mens' locker room was covered with building paper. The shelters were repaired and painted and the Club House roof was repaired and given one coat of paint. New verandah steps were constructed. The rustic arch at the entrance of the Course was painted. The garage floor was laid with wood blocks. Equipment, including a five-unit mower, set of harrows and set of discs and two spare sections for Toro mowers was purchased.

The tees on numbers 1 and 3 were moved to better locations, number 3 being thereby shortened to 485 yards. The moving of these tees speeded up play considerably on the first two fairways. The paths around the Club House were recurbed with creosoted plank. Expenditure Labour \$ 3,212.96 Material 3,419.62

MEWATA PARK: All work on this park has been abandoned for the time being due to its occupancy by the troops. A swimming pool has been partly constructed in this Park under the supervision of the Engineer's Department, at a cost of \$ 26,542.25 to date. The completion of this pool has been deferred for the time being. In the meantime the area has been enclosed with a chain link fence on the front and a close has been enclosed with a chain link fence on the front and a close board fence on the other sides. The area within this fence has been graded. Fencing was purchased to enclose the space extending from the west end of the ball ground to the west end of the park but, due to the park being occupied by the troops, was not erected. The comfort station, which was in an extremely dilapidated condition and had not been in use for several years, was demolished. All playground apparatus was removed from the park when the military authorities took possession took possession.

MEWATA STADIUM: The grandstand was painted and re-numbered. Those portions of the fence that had been renovated were also painted together with the flag pole. New permanent bleachers were erected on the east side of the grandstand. A new entrance and ticket box was provided at the south-east corner.

Relief labour 360 hours.

Seven portable bleachers were purchased from the South African Veterans' Association to replace some that, due to deterioration, had to be destroyed. The track was scarified and resurfaced with shale. The dressing room for men beneath the grandstand was enlarged, making it double its original size.

The fence on the north side had to be moved in some little

distance to provide space for the military huts. Flood lighting was installed at a cost of \$ 6,401.12. The Stadium has been completely closed for the winter months. All equipment that it was possible to remove has been placed in storage and the infield heavily coated with manure.

PARKVIEW SWIMMING POOL GROUNDS: In view of the popularity of the swimming area in the Elbow River in the Parkview district, it was found necessary to keep a revolving shift of watchmen here during the summer season.

BOULEVARDS: Two hundred and fifty feet of new boulevard was trenched, graded, curbed and seeded and trees and shrubs planted, at 8th Avenue, east of 12th Street East alongside of the Chinook Bowling greens. Ninety feet of boulevard was renovated on St. Monica Avenue. The boulevard at the new Latter Day Saints' Church on Rosedale Crescent was lowered and prepared for re-seeding next spring. One hundred and twenty-five feet of new boulevard was made on 19th Avenue N.W. east of 1st Street east. Flower beds were prepared on the boulevard that forms the bank of the river on 26th Avenue between 1st boulevard that forms the bank of the river on 26th Avenue between 1st and 4th Streets West.

CEMETERIES, GENERAL:

The usual service and assistance was given on these occasions. Most of the roads were resurfaced with fine gravel during the season and all were scarified in the late fall. Calcium chloride was used on the roads and gutters as a weed destroyer, with remarkably good results. A number of refuse containers were purchased for the Cemeteries. All seats and signs are being painted during the winter.

UNION CEMETERY: Additional species of trees and shrubs were planted on the west slope. This area is gradually being developed into a very interesting arboretum, and a demonstration ground showing what material of this kind can be grown here. The periodic dressing of certain grass areas with a preparation of sulphate of ammonia and sulphate of iron has been continued and

has proved conclusively that, if this treatment is persevered with over a period of years the dandelion nuisance can be greatly reduced. A commencement was made to replace the rough fence with chain

link fencing.

A heavy dressing of manure was spread on sections, D, C, L, N, P, S and T. Considerable work is entailed annually in keeping the markers used for numbering plots clear of an overgrowth of grass. All trees and shrubs on plots, whether isolated or in groups, must also be annually cleared of the growth of grass and cultivated. BURNSLAND CEMETERY: A twelve-inch surface drain and catch basin was installed and connected with sewer in the vicinity of Section K. One new block of lots was laid out and markers placed on Section P and two on Section L, providing in all 422 new plots. Blocks 1 to 4 on Section L were gradeā, levelled and loamed. Manure was spread on the newly seeded portion of Section G, the total area improved being 16,960 square feet. Nine rose beds were prepared and planted with 420 roses. These beds made a magnificent display and were much admired by the public. This Cemetery is rapidly being filled, and I estimate that by the middle of 1941 at the latest, the new cemetery site will be required for burial purposes.

ST. MARY'S EXTENSION: The roadway in this Cemetery requires surfacing with fine gravel. One new block of plots was laid out and

markers placed, providing 109 additional plots. The unused portion of this Cemetery that has been graded was prepared for seeding to grass next spring.

To improve the appearance of this Cemetery it has been decided to close that portion of 31st Avenue between the old and new portions of this Cemetery, together with that of Erlton Street that bounds the new area on the west side, and the necessary legal proceedings are now under way for that purpose. By doing this a very much more pleasing and imposing entrance can be made at the east end of the closed portion on 31st Avenue and the two portions of the Cemetery combined to form one unit.

NURSERIES: Spring work started the first week in April. Tree-lifting commenced the second week in April. The nursery furnished the follow-ing material for permanent planting in the several parks, cemeteries, etc. - 1,889 trees, 3,806 shrubs, 32,945 perennials, and 53 vines. In addition 414 trees were purchased for street planting and 1,106 shrubs for general planting. Three hundred and eight shrubs were donated to the Department.

Ten thousand four hundred and fifty tree and shrub cuttings were made during the winter and planted in the spring.

Two thousand one hundred and sixty-nine trees and shrubs were transplanted in the nursery.

Four thousand and nine perennial plants were propagated by division. Eight thousand one hundred and sixty-six seedling perennial plants were raised in greenhouse and on hotbeds and were lined out. Twenty-seven kinds and varieties of tree and shrub seeds were collected and sown.

Six hundred and twenty-eight kinds and varieties of herbaceous and alpine seeds was collected.

Trees and shrubs were donated for trial as follows :-

From Provincial Horticultural Station, Brooks:

10 New apple crosses.

20 Plum No. 89 special seedlings.

Seed was exchanged as in other years, and a considerable amount of seed was acquired in this way, nearly 400 packets. A complete list of seed donated is included in this report. An inventory of nursery stock was completed in November.

The germination of seed was good, but the strike of cuttings was only fair, probably due to lack of moisture after growth had begun. The majority of cuttings had of necessity to be planted in an out-of-the-way place where watering facilities are poor.

There was considerable winter killing of trees and shrubs during the winter of 1938-9. Spiraea Van Houtei and S. arguta died back to the ground. Crabs and European Ash also suffered badly. Many new kinds of seedling shrubs were planted for trial, but a

satisfactory report on these cannot be made until next year. There was a heavy fall of snow in October which stopped the usual fall nursery work. After the snow disappeared the land was too wet to work until freeze-up.

The small propagating houses, hotbeds and frameyards used in connection with the nurseries have, over a period of years proved an invaluable asset. Many of the species of trees, shrubs and perennial flowering plants that have been introduced, have become acclimatized, and have added so substantially to the variety and beauty of our plantings, could not have been established without these facilities.

due to the fact that many of these, whilst hardy in an advanced stage of growth are not so in the seedling stage and require special care or growth are not so in the seeding stage and require special care and attention during the period of germination and early growth. Furthermore, even without these facilities the raising of herbaceous perennials except in a very small way would have been impossible and with the more hardy types, these facilities greatly speed up the re-stocking of our nurseries, as material sufficiently matured for permanent planting is used. To give some idea of the immense amount of material raised in this way I beg to call attention to the fact that during the past 10 years 421,049 trees, shrubs and herbaceous plants have been raised on these hotbeds. WORK SHOP: The following new equipment was purchased and put into service. Two Toro motor mowers, 2 Cumberland motor scythes, 1 Toro tractor sickle bar, 16 Blue Bird hand mowers, 2 spiked rollers, 1 Boston Giant sprinkler, 1 - 5 section Titan mower and 1 spare section. The Titan mowers for the Golf Course were received too late in the season to be put into use. The Toro motor mowers gave very great satisfaction. The Toro tractor sickle bar used at the Golf Course, according to reports, is far ahead for speed and efficiency of the old hay mower. Most of the sixteen Blue Bird hand mowers were sent to the Cemeteries and seemed to work well and stand up. Equipment made:

Two hundred and forty-seven pieces of equipment was repaired, 2,102 pieces painted, 152 pieces re-built and overhauled and 608 pieces sharpened.

POLICING: The Patrolman regularly employed by the Department left on September 15th, to enlist with the C.A.S.F. and was not replaced, as very excellent services rendered by the Corps of Commissionaires seemed to render this unnecessary. I take this opportunity to pay tribute to the splendid work of these men in patrolling the parks and preventing destruction of property and misconduct. Their and preventing destruction of property and misconduct. Their courteous and diplomatic methods seems to gain the confidence of the public and often the goodwill of those they have to reprimand with the result that these would-be miscreants become their allies. It is unfortunate that it is not possible to have the whole of the city covered by these men.

MISCELLANEOUS: The usual assistance was given during the Fair in providing play apparatus and an enclosure for lost children, also flowers for decorating certain of the buildings. Groups were set up and other assistance given at the several Flower Shows, during the Bonspiel by providing facilities for the transportation of curling

stones and to Sunshine for the delivery of Christmas hampers. Work to the extent of 346 hours was provided for at the office for certain relief recipients who are unable to do heavy manual labour.

Assistance was given to the various truck drivers throughout the year, 17,515 hours of relief labour being used in this way. Due to the ever-increasing popularity of the many swimming holes of the rivers within the City limits and the fact that many relief recipients are unable to undertake heavy manual work it has been found advantageous to use this labour in patrolling and supervising these swimming holes, 9,414 hours of relief labour being used on this work.
