




Labour Market


- The unemployment rate in the Calgary Economic Region (CER) was 4.6 per cent in January 2013, down from 4.9 per cent in the same time last year. Nationally, the unemployment rate was 6.9 per cent, down from 7.3 per cent in January 2012.
- Total employment in the CER was 813,800 in January 2013, an increase of 18,000 or 2.3 per cent from 795,800 in January 2012.
- The 2012 Civic Census placed Calgary's population at 1,120,200, up from 1,090,900 in 2011, representing an increase of 29,300 persons.

Unemployment Rates, Canada and Provinces (Seasonally adjusted)












Labour Market (continued)

Between December 2011 and December 2012, the number of Calgarians receiving regular employment insurance fell by 2.3 per cent to 8,090. For Alberta, in the same time period, the number fell by 7.9 per cent to 27,160.






Energy

- In January 2013, the average price of crude oil (WTI) was US\$94.83/bbl, up 7.5 per cent from December 2012 but down 5.5 per cent from a year ago.
- The average price of natural gas (AECO) was \$2.92/GJ in January 2013, down 3 per cent from the previous month but up 21.2 per cent from January 2012.






Prices

- In January 2013, Calgary's 12-month-moving-average inflation rate decreased to 0.8 per cent from 1 per cent in December 2012 and 2.3 per cent in January 2012. Nationally, the inflation rate also decreased to 1.4 per cent from 1.5 per cent in the previous month and 2.9 per cent in January 2012.
- In Alberta, the average hourly wage inflation rate in January 2013 was 6.1 per cent, increased from 3.5 per cent a year ago. The average weekly earnings growth rate was 1.6 per cent in December 2012, increased from 5 per cent in December 2011.







General Indicators

- Canada's real gross domestic product (GDP) growth:
 - ▶ Month-over-month: edged up 0.3 per cent in November 2012, following a 0.1 per cent growth in October.
 - ▶ **Year-over-year**: increased 1.3 per cent in November 2012, following a 1.1 per cent growth in October.
- The Canadian prime business loan rate remained unchanged at 3 per cent in January 2013.

Canada Gross Domestic Product Growth (Seasonally adjusted, per cent)









Consumer Indicators

- In December 2012, total retail sales in the CER was estimated at \$2.3 billion, down 1.9 per cent from November but up 2.4 per cent from a year ago. Alberta retail sales were estimated at \$5.7 billion, indicating a 2.5 per cent decrease over the previous month but a 1.9 per cent increase year-over-year.
- The Index of Consumer Confidence increased in January 2013 by 5.1 points to 83 (2002 = 100).
- In January 2013, total housing starts in Calgary (CMA) reached 719 units, down from 866 units in last December and 786 units a year ago.
- Calgary housing sales in January 2013 was 1,572 units, up 17.1 per cent from 1,343 units in last December and 20.2 per cent from 1,308 units a year ago.
- January's MLS average sale price for Calgary was \$418,938, down 0.2 per cent from last month's average of \$419,811, but up 9.5 per cent from \$382,468 a year ago.











Business Indicators

- Alberta wholesale merchants' sales were estimated at \$6.6 billion (seasonally adjusted) in December 2012, down 1.3 per cent from the previous month but up 4.1 per cent from a year ago.
- Alberta manufacturing sales were estimated at \$5.8 billion (seasonally adjusted) in December 2012, down 4.5 per cent from the previous month and 9 per cent from a year ago.
- In January 2013, the total building permit value in the city of Calgary reached \$279 million, a 3.8 per cent decrease from last month's total of \$289 million, but a 19.1 per cent increase from \$234 million a year ago.
