




#### Labour Market (Unadjusted)


- The unemployment rate in the Calgary Economic Region (CER) was 5 per cent in February 2013, up from 4.9 per cent in the same time last year. Nationally, the unemployment rate was 7.1 per cent, down from 7.5 per cent in February 2012.
- Total employment in the Calgary Economic Region (CER) was 814,400 in February 2013, a 2.5 per cent increase from 794,400 in February 2012.
- The CER's working age population was estimated at 1,158,000 in February 2013, up 35,500 from February 2012.

#### Unemployment Rates, Canada and Provinces (Seasonally adjusted)










#### Labour Market (continued)

■ Between January 2012 and January 2013, the number of Calgarians receiving regular employment insurance fell by 2.5 per cent to 9,400. For Alberta, in the same time period, the number fell by 10.7 per cent to 28,800.






#### Energy

- In February 2013, the average price of crude oil (WTI) was US\$95.32/bbl, up 0.5 per cent from January 2013 but down 6.8 per cent from a year ago.
- The average price of natural gas (AECO) was \$2.91/GJ in February 2013, down 0.3 per cent from the previous month but up 42 per cent from February 2012.






#### Prices

- In February 2013, Calgary's 12-month-moving-average inflation rate decreased to 0.7 per cent from 0.8 per cent in January 2013 and 2.4 per cent in February 2012. Nationally, the inflation rate also decreased to 1.2 per cent from 1.4 per cent in the previous month and 3 per cent in February 2012.
- In Alberta, the average hourly wage inflation rate in February 2013 was 5.2 per cent, increased from 2.1 per cent a year ago. The average weekly earnings growth rate was 2.4 per cent in January 2013, increased from 2.1 per cent in January 2012.








#### General Indicators

- Canada's real gross domestic product (GDP) growth:
  - ▶ Month-over-month: edged up 0.2 per cent in January 2013, following a 0.2 per cent decrease in December 2012.
  - ▶ Year-over-year: increased 1 per cent in January 2013, following a 0.7 per cent growth in December 2012.
- The Canadian prime business loan rate remained unchanged at 3 per cent in February 2013.

### Canada Gross Domestic Product Growth (Seasonally adjusted, per cent)



#### Consumer Indicators


- In January 2013, total retail sales in the CER was estimated at \$2.3 billion (seasonally adjusted), up 0.4 per cent from December and 2.9 per cent from a year ago. Alberta retail sales were estimated at \$5.8 billion (seasonally adjusted), indicating a 1.3 per cent increase over the previous month and a 2.9 per cent increase year-over-year.
- The Index of Consumer Confidence decreased in February 2013 by 2.2 points to 80.8 (2002 = 100).
- In February 2013, total housing starts in Calgary (CMA) reached 896 units, up from 719 units in January but down from 1,345 units a year ago.
- Calgary housing sales in February 2013 was 2,071 units, up 31.7 per cent from 1,572 units in last January and 2 per cent from 2,113 units a year ago.
- February's MLS average sale price for Calgary was \$438,755, up 4.7 per cent from last month's average of \$418,938, but up 8.2 per cent from \$405,687 a year ago.











#### **Business Indicators**

- Alberta wholesale merchants' sales were estimated at \$6.5 billion (seasonally adjusted) in January 2013, up 0.2 per cent from the previous month and 3.4 per cent from a year ago.
- Alberta manufacturing sales were estimated at \$6.3 billion (seasonally adjusted) in January 2013, up 6.3 per cent from the previous month but down 0 per cent from a year ago.
- In February 2013, the total building permit value in the city of Calgary reached \$437 million, a 57 per cent increase from last month's total of \$279 million, and a 23.7 per cent increase from \$353 million a year ago.
