




### Labour Market (Unadjusted)


- The unemployment rate in the Calgary Economic Region (CER) was 5.1 per cent in March 2013, it remained unchanged compared to the same time last year. Nationally, the unemployment rate was 7.5 per cent, down from 7.8 per cent in March 2012.
- Total employment in the Calgary Economic Region (CER) was 808,700 in March 2013, a 1.7 per cent increase from 795,400 in March 2012.
- The CER's working age population was estimated at 1,161,300 in March 2013, up 36,900 from March 2012.

### Unemployment Rates, Canada and Provinces (Seasonally adjusted)










### Labour Market (continued)

■ Between February 2012 and February 2013, the number of Calgarians receiving regular employment insurance fell by 1.8 per cent to 9,350 year-over-year. For Alberta, in the same time period, the number fell by 8.2 per cent to 28,780 year-over-year.






### Energy

- In March 2013, the average price of crude oil (WTI) was US\$92.96/bbl, down 2.5 per cent from February 2013 and 12.5 per cent from March 2012.
- The average price of natural gas (AECO) was \$3.26/GJ in March 2013, up 12 per cent from the previous month and 90.6 per cent from March 2012.






#### Prices

- In March 2013, Calgary's 12-month-moving-average inflation rate remained unchanged at 0.7 per cent compared to the previous month but down from 2.4 per cent from March 2012. Nationally, the inflation rate also remained unchanged at 1.2 per cent in March 2013 from the previous month, but decreased from 2.8 per cent in March 2012.
- In Alberta, the average hourly wage inflation rate in March 2013 was 7.1 per cent, increased from 3.2 per cent a year ago. The average weekly earnings growth rate was 3.5 per cent in February 2013, increased from 2.1 per cent in February 2012.








#### General Indicators

- Canada's real gross domestic product (GDP) growth:
  - ▶ Month-over-month: edged up 0.3 per cent in February 2013, following a 0.3 per cent increase in January 2013.
  - ▶ **Year-over-year**: increased 1.7 per cent in February 2013, following a 1.1 per cent growth in January 2013.
- The Canadian prime business loan rate remained unchanged at 3 per cent in March 2013.


#### Consumer Indicators

- In February 2013, total retail sales in the CER was estimated at \$2.4 billion (seasonally adjusted), up 4.1 per cent from January and 9.2 per cent from a year ago. Alberta retail sales were estimated at \$6 billion (seasonally adjusted), indicating a 2.2 per cent increase over the previous month and a 7.4 per cent increase year-over-year.
- The Index of Consumer Confidence decreased in March 2013 by 0.3 point to 80.5 (2002 = 100) from February 2013.
- In March 2013, total housing starts in Calgary (CMA) reached 890 units, down from 896 units in February and 1,069 units a year ago.
- Calgary housing sales in March 2013 was 2,631 units, up 27 per cent from 2,071 units in last February but down 0.6 per cent from 2,647 units a year ago.
- March's MLS average sale price for Calgary was \$441,424, up 0.6 per cent from last month's average of \$438,755 and 7.7 per cent from \$409,750 a year ago.












#### **Business Indicators**

- Alberta wholesale merchants' sales were estimated at \$6.7 billion (seasonally adjusted) in February 2013, up 2 per cent from the previous month and 6.5 per cent from a year ago.
- Alberta manufacturing sales were estimated at \$6.4 billion (seasonally adjusted) in February 2013, up 0.7 per cent from the previous month and 1.4 per cent from a year ago.
- In March 2013, the total building permit value in the city of Calgary reached \$477 million, a 9 per cent increase from February's total of \$437 million, and a 24.6 per cent increase from \$383 million a year ago.
