




#### Labour Market (Unadjusted)


- The unemployment rate in the Calgary Economic Region (CER) was 4.8 per cent in September 2013, down from 5.1 per cent for the same time last year. Nationally, the unemployment rate was 7.1 per cent, down from 7.3 per cent in September 2012.
- Total employment in the Calgary Economic Region (CER) was 847,100 in September 2013, a 4.7 per cent increase from 809,400 in September 2012.
- The CER's working age population was estimated at 1,186,600 in September 2013, up 44,900 from September 2012.

## Unemployment Rates, Canada and Provinces (Seasonally adjusted)












### Labour Market (continued)

■ Between August 2012 and August 2013, the number of Calgarians receiving regular employment insurance fell by 3.2 per cent to 9,770. For Alberta, during the same time period, the number fell by 3 per cent to 30,030 year-over-year.






### Energy

- In September 2013, the average price for crude oil (WTI) was US\$106.24/bbl, down 0.3 per cent from August 2013 but up 12.4 per cent from a year ago.
- The average price for natural gas (AECO) was \$2.09/GJ in September 2013, down 11.1 per cent from the previous month and 4.6 per cent from September 2012.








#### Prices

- In September 2013, Calgary's 12-month-moving-average inflation rate remained unchanged at 1.2 per cent compared to the previous month but down from 1.7 per cent in September 2012. Nationally, the inflation rate also remained unchanged at 0.9 per cent in September 2013 from the previous month, but decreased from 2 per cent in September 2012.
- In Alberta, the average hourly wage inflation rate in September 2013 was 2.7 per cent, decreased from 6.5 per cent a year ago. The average weekly earnings growth rate was 2.5 per cent in August 2013, increased from 2.2 per cent in August 2012.






#### General Indicators

- Canada's real gross domestic product (GDP) growth:
  - ▶ Month-over-month: decelerated to 0.3 per cent in August 2013, following a 0.6 per cent increase in July 2013.
  - ▶ Year-over-year: increased 2 per cent in August 2013, following a 1.5 per cent growth in July 2013.
- The Canadian prime business loan rate remained unchanged at 3 per cent in September 2013.








#### Consumer Indicators

- In August 2013, total retail sales in the CER was estimated at \$2.4 billion (seasonally adjusted), down 1.1 per cent from July but up 7.6 per cent from a year ago. Alberta retail sales were estimated at \$6.1 billion (seasonally adjusted), indicating a 0.1 per cent increase over the previous month and a 5.5 per cent increase year-over-year.
- The Index of Consumer Confidence increased in September 2013, rising 6.3 points to 91 (2002 = 100) from August 2013.
- In September 2013, total housing starts in Calgary (CMA) reached 904 units, down from 982 units in August and 1,012 units a year ago.
- Calgary housing sales in September 2013 was 2,475 units, down 12.5 per cent from 2,830 units in August but up 20.5 per cent from 2,054 units a year ago.
- September's MLS average sale price for Calgary was \$435,934, up 0.8 per cent from August's average of \$432,576 and 8.2 per cent from \$402,756 a year ago.











#### **Business Indicators**

- Alberta wholesale merchants' sales were estimated at \$6.6 billion (seasonally adjusted) in August 2013, down 0.7 per cent from the previous month but up 1.6 per cent from a year ago.
- Alberta manufacturing sales were estimated at \$6.5 billion (seasonally adjusted) in August 2013, up 1.9 per cent from the previous month and 8 per cent from the same time last year.
- In September 2013, the total building permit value in the city of Calgary reached \$517 million, a 7.3 per cent increase from August's total of \$482 million, and a 71.2 per cent increase from \$302 million a year ago. The total building permit value for the three quarters of 2013 was \$4.54 billion, up from \$3.62 billion for the same period 2012.
