



#### Labour Market (Unadjusted)

- The unemployment rate in the Calgary Economic Region (CER) was 4.7 per cent in October 2013, down from 4.8 per cent for the same time last year. Nationally, the unemployment rate was 6.8 per cent, down from 7.1 per cent in October 2012.
- Total employment in the Calgary Economic Region (CER) was 846,700 in October 2013, a 4.7 per cent increase from 808,600 in October 2012.
- The CER's working age population was estimated at 1,190,600 in October 2013, up 46,000 from October 2012.

### Unemployment Rates, Canada and Provinces (Seasonally adjusted)









### Labour Market (continued)

 Between September 2012 and September 2013, the number of Calgarians receiving regular employment insurance increased by 3.6 per cent to 10,030. For Alberta, during the same time period, the number fell by 2 per cent to 29,140 year-over-year.



### Energy

- In October 2013, the average price for crude oil (WTI) was US\$100.55/bbl, down 5.4 per cent from September 2013 but up 12.3 per cent from a year ago.
- The average price for natural gas (AECO) was \$3.11/GJ in October 2013, up 7.6 per cent from the previous month and 5.8 per cent from October 2012.






#### Prices

- In October 2013, Calgary's 12-month-movingaverage inflation rate increased to 1.3 per cent from 1.2 per cent in September 2013 but down from 1.5 per cent in October 2012. Nationally, the inflation rate remained unchanged at 0.9 per cent in October 2013 from the previous month, but decreased from 1.8 per cent in October 2012.
- In Alberta, the average hourly wage inflation rate in October 2013 was 2.1 per cent, decreased from 6.6 per cent a year ago. The average weekly earnings growth rate was 2.9 per cent in September 2013, decreased from 3.8 per cent in September 2012.







Alberta Average Wage Inflation

General Indicators

- Canada's real gross domestic product (GDP) growth:
  - Month-over-month: grew 0.3 per cent in September 2013, a third consecutive monthly increase.
  - ▶ Year-over-year: increased 2.3 per cent in September 2013, following a 2 per cent growth in August 2013.
- The Canadian prime business loan rate remained unchanged at 3 per cent in October 2013.







### **Consumer Indicators**

- In September 2013, total retail sales in the CER was estimated at \$2.4 billion (seasonally adjusted), down 0.3 per cent from August but up 6.4 per cent from a year ago. Alberta retail sales were estimated at \$6.2 billion (seasonally adjusted), indicating a 2 per cent increase over the previous month and a 6.3 per cent increase year-over-year.
- The Index of Consumer Confidence decreased in October 2013, dropping 2.1 points to 88.9 (2002=100) in September 2013.
- In October 2013, total housing starts in Calgary (CMA) reached 1,162 units, up from 904 units in September and 980 units a year ago.
- Calgary housing sales in October 2013 was 2,510 units, up 1.4 per cent from 2,475 units in September and 19.3 per cent from 2,104 units a year ago.
- October's MLS average sale price for Calgary was \$436,216, up 0.1 per cent from September's average of \$435,934 and 4.2 per cent from \$418,721 a year ago.








### **Business Indicators**

- Alberta wholesale merchants' sales were estimated at \$6.6 billion (seasonally adjusted) in September 2013, up 1.3 per cent from a year ago.
- Alberta manufacturing sales were estimated at \$6.3 billion (seasonally adjusted) in September 2013, down 3.6 per cent from the previous month but up 2.2 per cent from the same time last year.
- In October 2013, the total building permit value in the city of Calgary reached \$477 million, a 7.6 per cent decrease from September's total of \$517 million, but a 74 per cent increase from \$274 million a year ago. The total building permit value for the first ten months of 2013 totalled \$5.02 billion, up from \$3.89 billion for the same period 2012.
