


Labour Market (Unadjusted)

- The unemployment rate in the Calgary Economic Region (CER) was 4.4 per cent in December 2013, up from 4.3 per cent for the same time last year. Nationally, the unemployment rate was 6.5 per cent, down from 6.6 per cent in December 2012.
- Total employment in the CER was 846,700 in December 2013, a 3.8 per cent increase from 815,500 in December 2012.
- The CER's working age population was estimated at 1,197,600 in December 2013, up 46,500 from December 2012.





Between November 2012 and November 2013, the number of Calgarians receiving regular employment insurance fell by 1 per cent to 9,630. For Alberta, during the same time period, the number fell by 3.4 per cent to 29,060 yearover-year.






Energy

- In December 2013, the average price for crude oil (WTI) was US\$97.91/bbl, up 4.2 per cent from November 2013 and 10.9 per cent from a year ago.
- The average price for natural gas (AECO) was \$3.68/GJ in December 2013, up 13.6 per cent from the previous month and 22.3 per cent from December 2012.






Prices

- In December 2013, Calgary's 12-monthmoving-average inflation rate increased to 1.7 per cent from 1.5 per cent in November 2013 and 1 per cent in December 2012. Nationally, the inflation rate remained unchanged at 0.9 per cent in December 2013 from the previous month, but decreased from 1.5 per cent in December 2012.
- In Alberta, the average hourly wage inflation rate in December 2013 was 1.9 per cent, decreased from 5.5 per cent a year ago. The average weekly earnings growth rate was 4.2 per cent in November 2013, increased from 1.8 per cent in November 2012.







Alberta Average Wage Inflation

General Indicators

- Canada's real gross domestic product (GDP) growth:
 - ▶ Month-over-month: grew 0.3 per cent in October 2013, a fourth consecutive monthly increase.
 - ▶ Year-over-year: increased 2.7 per cent in October 2013, following a 2.4 per cent growth in September 2013.
- The Canadian prime business loan rate remained unchanged at 3 per cent in December 2013.








Consumer Indicators

- In November 2013, total retail sales in the CER was estimated at \$2.5 billion (seasonally adjusted), up 2.4 per cent from August and 7.8 per cent from a year ago. Alberta retail sales were estimated at \$6.2 billion (seasonally adjusted), indicating a 0.6 per cent increase over the previous month and a 6.8 per cent increase year-over-year.
- The Index of Consumer Confidence in December has declined for a third consecutive month, dropping 6.6 points from November to 80.5 (2002=100).
- In December 2013, total housing starts in Calgary (CMA) reached 896 units, down from 1,693 units in November but up from 866 units a year ago.
- Calgary housing sales in December was 1,464 units, down 32.6 per cent from 2,173 units in November but up 9 per cent from 1,343 units a year ago.
- December's MLS average sale price for Calgary was \$439,389, down 1.3 per cent from November's average of \$445,114, but up 4.7 per cent from \$419,811 a year ago.









Business Indicators

- Alberta wholesale merchants' sales were estimated at \$6.7 billion (seasonally adjusted) in November 2013, down 2.4 per cent from the previous month but up 1.5 per cent from a year ago.
- Alberta manufacturing sales were estimated at \$6.4 billion (seasonally adjusted) in November 2013, up 0.6 per cent from the previous month and 7.1 per cent from the same time last year.
- In December 2013, the total building permit value in the city of Calgary reached \$486 million, a 12 per cent decrease from November's total of \$553 million, but a 70.6 per cent increase from \$285 million a year ago. The total building permit value for the entire year of 2013 was \$6.1 billion, up from \$4.4 billion for 2012.
