




Labour Market (Unadjusted)


- The unemployment rate in the Calgary Economic Region (CER) was 4.5 per cent in January 2014, down from 4.6 per cent in January 2013. Nationally, the unemployment rate was 6.9 per cent in January 2014, but no change from a year ago.
- Total employment in the Calgary Economic Region (CER) was 845,400 in January 2014, a 3.9 per cent increase from 813,800 in January 2013.
- The CER's working age population was estimated at 1,200,900 in January 2014, up 46,300 from January 2013.

Unemployment Rates, Canada and Provinces (Seasonally adjusted)












Labour Market (continued)

Between December 2012 and December 2013, the number of Calgarians receiving regular employment insurance fell by 0.8 per cent to 9,670. For Alberta, during the same time period, the number fell by 0.6 per cent to 29,720 yearover-year.






Energy

- In January 2014, the average price for crude oil (WTI) was US\$94.86/bbl, down 3.1 per cent from December 2013 but no change from a year ago.
- The average price for natural gas (AECO) was \$4.08/GJ in January 2014, up 10.9 per cent from the previous month and 39.7 per cent from January 2013. This price increase was driven up by the frigid weather experienced in much of the United States and Eastern and Central Canada in January 2014.








Prices

- In January 2014, Calgary's 12-month-movingaverage inflation rate increased to 2 per cent from 1.7 per cent in December 2013 and 0.8 per cent in January 2013. Nationally, the inflation rate also increased to 1 per cent from 0.9 per cent in the previous month but down from 1.4 per cent in January 2013.
- In Alberta, the average hourly wage inflation rate in January 2014 was 1.3 per cent, decreased from 6.1 per cent a year ago. The average weekly earnings growth rate was 3.4 per cent in December 2013, increased from 2.7 per cent in December 2012.








General Indicators

- Canada's real gross domestic product (GDP) growth:
 - ▶ Month-over-month: edged up 0.2 per cent in November 2013, following a 0.3 per cent growth in October 2013.
 - ▶ Year-over-year: increased 2.6 per cent in November 2013, following a 2.7 per cent growth in October.
- The Canadian prime business loan rate remained unchanged at 3 per cent in January 2014.








Consumer Indicators

- In December 2013, total retail sales in the CER was estimated at \$2.4 billion (seasonally adjusted), down 3.2 per cent from November but up 5.4 per cent from a year ago. Alberta retail sales were estimated at \$6.2 billion (seasonally adjusted), indicating a 1.1 per cent decrease over the previous month but a 7.3 per cent increase year-over-year.
- The Index of Consumer Confidence increased in January 2014 by 0.9 point to 81.4 (2002 = 100).
- In January 2014, total housing starts in Calgary (CMA) reached 1,328 units, up from 896 units in December 2013 and 719 units a year ago.
- Calgary housing sales in January 2014 was 1,802 units, up 23.1 per cent from 1,464 units in December 2013 and 14.6 per cent from 1,572 units a year ago.
- MLS average sale price for Calgary in January 2014 was \$444,153, up 1.1 per cent from December's average of \$439,389 and 6 per cent from \$418,938 a year ago.











Business Indicators

- Alberta wholesale merchants' sales were estimated at \$6.5 billion (seasonally adjusted) in December 2013, down 2.5 per cent from the previous month and 0.2 per cent from a year ago.
- Alberta manufacturing sales were estimated at \$6.2 billion (seasonally adjusted) in December 2013, down 2.8 per cent from the previous month but up 4.8 per cent from the same time last year.
- In January 2014, the total building permit value in the city of Calgary reached \$570 million, a 17.1 per cent increase from December's total of \$486 million, and a 106 per cent increase from \$277 million a year ago.
