

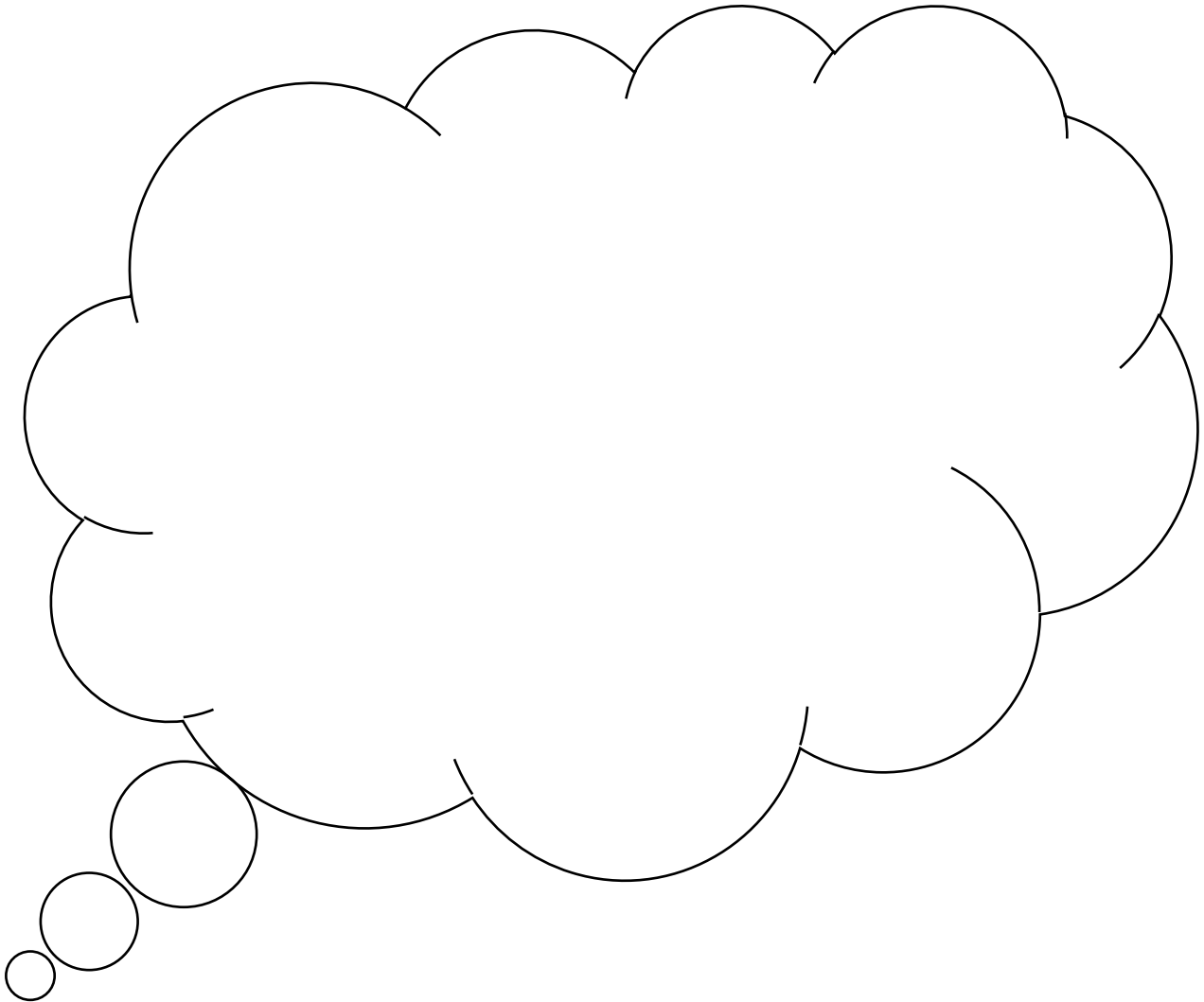


Rights, Respect, and Responsibility Poster

In this activity, you are tasked with designing a poster (on whatever platform you choose) on how the three R's – rights, respect, and responsibility – apply to the wildlife in your community.

Use the thought bubble to brainstorm ideas and answers to the following questions to get you started:

1. What wild animals can you find in or around your neighborhood?
2. What natural areas are around your home that you might be able to see these animals in?
3. What stories can I find in the local news about wildlife encounters in Calgary?
4. Are there any specific animals or stories that resonate with me?

Specific Learner Outcomes

- ✓ Science Inquiry – Focus
 - ask questions that lead to exploration and investigation
- ✓ Science Inquiry – Explore and Investigate
 - identify sources of information and ideas and demonstrate skill in accessing them. Sources may include library, classroom, community and computer-based resources
- ✓ Science Inquiry – Reflect & Interpret
 - communicate effectively with group members in sharing and evaluating ideas, and assessing progress
 - identify applications of what was learned
 - identify new questions that arise from investigation
- ✓ Attitudes
 - curiosity
 - confidence in personal ability to explore materials and learn by direct study
 - a sense of responsibility for personal and group actions
 - respect for living things and environments, and commitment for their care.
