

Enmax Legacy Parks Program — Nose Hill Regional Park



Nose Hill Park

Project: The *Nose Hill Trail and Pathway Plan* was developed in 2004 with significant public input to address a variety of longstanding challenges in the park, including the proliferation of more than 300 km of informal trails. Beginning in 2006, Parks started implementing changes to improve the sustainability of the flora and fauna as well as providing better visitor services, education and circulation management.

Budget: \$4.5M Enmax Legacy Parks Program funds of the \$6.6M total.

Timeline: 2007–2011, plus ongoing trail repairs and rehabilitation.
Interpretive/orientation signage and additional trail restoration completed in 2012.
Additional trail work will continue for several years to complete the site.

Benefits: The largest park in The City of Calgary's system, this 2500 acre site has significant swaths of prairie grasslands as well as robust flora and fauna populations contributing to Calgary's biodiversity. A well loved walking area, this park is an exceptional example of urban prairie.
